# Putting Everything Together or "How Does All This Work?"

#### What is confirmation?

The Rite of Confirmation is a worship service in which you'll have a chance to tell the people around you what you believe. You'll hear the promises given to you when you were baptized, and you'll get to say, "Yes, I believe those promises belong to me!" That's why we call it the **Service of Affirmation of Baptism**; you *affirm* (or say yes) to your baptism and all it means. Our Confirmation Program is designed to help you explore and discover what you're saying yes to! The Service for Affirmation of Baptism will be held on Reformation Sunday, the last Sunday in October each year, for our Ninth Graders who've completed Confirmation.

#### Why do we do confirmation anyway?

Five hundred years ago Martin Luther took a trip to the peasant country to find out how the church was doing out there. He wasn't pleased; people didn't even know the basics of the faith. So old Martin decided to do something about it. He wrote the *Small Catechism* so parents could teach their kids about the faith and learn something themselves along the way.

All these years later, here you are on the receiving end of the *Small Catechism*, and we're still helping young people learn about their faith and strengthen their ties to the Church. We're not doing it just because we've always done it. We do confirmation *because it's a good idea*.


We live in a crazy world that's full of hard choices. We're surrounded by demanding voices. Confirmation is a good idea because it can help you understand that world and sort out the voices. Most of all, it's a good idea because at confirmation you can hear about the biggest choice of all: what God says about you in your baptism, "Yes! You're mine. And I'll never let you go!" That's a good thing to know and something you can depend on, too!

#### Why small groups?

You'll be learning all about God's choice for you in baptism by participating in a small group. Your group will have four or five other kids in it, along with an adult Guide. Along the way, you'll get to ask questions of people you trust, have some fun with your friends, and do some of the work that Jesus asks you to do.

#### "Take Me to Your Leader, Earthling"

The Education Committee manages the Confirmation Ministry. A worship workshop team helps plan and teach the Wednesday Night Workshop. Each small group has an adult Guide and five or six kids. The Pastor's job is to teach the content of confirmation, support the Guides, coordinate the Wednesday Night Workshops, and be available to the kids. Here's what our structure looks like:

# Life in a Small Group

## purpose

What are these Junior High/Confirmation Ministry small groups all about anyway? It's about getting to know each other, getting to know our Lord, and getting to know His Church.

who

Who are the small groups for? It's for you, that's who! That's how God works. He wants His gifts to be for you. The small groups are for you, for your friends, for anyone who needs a place to belong, to share and care for one another.

#### new people

Does this mean I can invite my friends who don't belong to Our Savior's? Sure. That would be a good way to put your faith to work in the real world. All we ask is that you help new people in your group understand and live by the ground rules.

study

What are we going to study in our small groups? You. Your world. Your God. We'll work to understand them all a little bit better by exploring the Bible and studying Martin Luther's Small Catechism.

# group agenda

What do you do in the group meetings? First, you'll gather in a large group for singing, games, activities and a chunk of God's Word. Then you'll break out into your small group which has these parts:

- a) Check-in: find out how everyone's doing.
- b) Scratch the surface: take a first look at the topic for the night.
- Dig deeper: use the Bible and the Catechism to understand the night's topic better.
- d) Taking it home: talk about what it all means for your life in the real world.
- e) Taking it to God: pray about things that concern you, thank God for things you're happy about, tell Him what you need.

# other activities

What else do we do with our small groups? On a regular basis you'll do an activity outside of the church building. For example, occasionally you'll do a fun fellowship activity with your group. Then, you may do a service project as a group.

guides

Who leads our meetings? Each group will have a carefully selected and supported adult guide. That person will make sure the group stays on track, keep your confidences, and be interested in what's happening in your life.

What are the ground rules for being in a small group? Each time your small group meets, you should go over the following ground rules for your life together:

priority

While you're a member of a small group, you give group meetings priority.

participation

Everyone participates in the small groups, but no one dominates.

respect

Everyone is given the right to their own opinion, and "dumb questions" are encouraged and respected. Everyone treats others as lovable, valuable and capable children of God.

new people

The group stays open to new people at every meeting, as long as they know and understand the ground rules.

confidentiality Anything that is said in the meeting is never repeated outside the meeting.

support

Permission is given to call upon each other (especially your Guide) in time of need – even in the middle of the night.

# **Service Projects**

# **Sermon Maps and Worship Notes**

## purpose

Why do we have to make sermon maps? There's no secret here. The reason for sermon maps is that Christians go to church. If you're going to have a living faith, there's no way you can do it without hearing God's Word in worship. The two go together like peanut butter and jelly, and green eggs and ham. Requiring sermon maps of you makes sure you and your family hears God's promises about you.

how

What do you do with a sermon map? If you've never done a sermon map before, it's as simple as anything. All you have to do is fill in the blanks on the side about worship. Then just listen to the sermon. Write down anything important that you hear, using the directions on the sermon map. Turn it in to your Small Group Guide who'll keep track of them through the year.


where

**How do I get a blank sermon map?** Out in the Fellowship Hall you'll find a counter outside the sanctuary doors. Blank sermon maps and pencils are kept in a tray on that counter. Don't put completed maps back in that tray – give them to your Guide.


how many

What's the requirement? You will have completed 15 sermon maps by May 6. That's not such a hard assignment when you remember that there are 42 different worship services you can complete a sermon map in by that time.

other requirements What else do I need to do as part of this confirmation ministry? Aside from completing 15 sermon maps, no other outside written assignments are required. You must attend and take part in every Wednesday Night Workshop, fellowship event and service project. All written work happens in your small group.
