Dear friends.

I always struggle with what to write for these Annual Reports. How does one sum up an entire year of being church together? So, after staring at an empty computer screen for a while, I decided to bag it and go for a run. Maybe I'd find some inspiration on the road.

It occurs to me... I run nearly every day (or at least 5 days a week). I do it for all sorts of reasons: it's what I've always done, to a greater or lesser extent, for about the past 44 years; it gets my heartrate up and keeps my metabolism from slowing to a crawl, as ever-aging bodies are wont to do; it releases endorphins that put me in a better mood and keep me from being too grouchy; and perhaps most importantly, it just keeps me sane. Through that physical exertion, I'm able to clear my head, work through problems, put things in their proper perspective. It sets my day.

For all that, this act of running can at times seem pointless. I always end up back where I started. Always. If I'm running on the roads or trails, it's always some kind of circuitous route that brings me back home or to my car. And if I happen to be on the treadmill, it looks even more ridiculous, as I've appeared to go absolutely nowhere!

How much of our everyday living seems to be mirrored in this exercise? Most of our days look pretty much the same... we get up, maybe grab some quick breakfast or cup of coffee... then it's off to work or school or wherever your day usually takes you. Sure, we occasionally mix it up with a day off or a weekend (which usually have their own routines) or maybe even an extended adventure of some sort. And yet, we always wake up the next day to start it all over again, often feeling as though we haven't moved much from where we started.

And yet... when you actually look back at where you've been, where you've gone, what you've done, you see that something has changed. When you're a kid, it can seem like you'll be a student forever, going through the same grind of homework and assignments and schedules, until all of the sudden you find yourself out of your childhood home and on your own. As a parent raising kids, the treadmill of the every-day can seem grinding... until one day you look around and you have adults leaving your nest, off to start lives and careers and families of *their* own. Through faithfully attending to the every-day, the work and love and time you've put in have changed your reality, and others are changed for it.

Most importantly, by attending to the disciplines of every-day living... no matter how routine or familiar or circuitous they may seem... *you* have changed. You're stronger in experience and spirit, if not in body... perhaps wiser, and maybe even more hopeful, knowing that paying attention and staying the course gives courage to face what you don't know.

Our life together as church is much like this. I look back at another year gone by and see much that is familiar: we worshipped together, we sang, prayed and communed together. We gathered around the Word and studied together in various groups, sharing our perspectives, our questions and our lived experiences. We celebrated new lives brought into our family of faith through baptism. We taught and played with our young ones, confirmed the faith of our adolescents, blessed and sent off our graduates. We blessed and prayed for our newly-married... listened to and held space for our troubled and wondering... tended to our sick and dying... and we walked to the grave with our grieving. The specifics and the names might change, but when it comes right down to it, this is just what the community of faith has always done, is called to do, and will wake up tomorrow doing.

I'm grateful for the many new faces that have appeared among us over the last twelve months, bringing new gifts to the whole Body of Christ in this place. I grieve the loss of those who have left us, whether by relocating or by death. But most of all, I rejoice and give thanks to God for the people around me here at OSLC... the wonderfully capable staff I get to work alongside each day, and every one of you with whom I get to share this journey.

So, looking ahead to another year... *let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us,* looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. Because, you see, we're not running in vain, as though going nowhere. In the every-day of being church together, God is in the process of *transforming us*, as the Apostle Paul says, *into the image of Jesus, from one degree of glory to another* (2 Cor. 3:18). Thanks be to God!



# Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

March 14, 2023 - 6:30 PM, Conference Room OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:36 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Andy Binder, Nichole Braithwait, Linda Easthouse, Christopher Egerdahl, Deming Haugland, Karson Klein, Cindy Koppinger, Mat Ornelas, and David Pummel.
- 2. **Devotions:** The Painted Boat Devotion focuses on the idea that you never know how a small kindness or action could affect someone's life in a positive way.
- Approve Agenda: David Pummel moved to approve the agenda; Nichole Braithwait seconded; motion carried.
- 4. Approval of the February Council Minutes: Linda Easthouse moved to approve the minutes of the February meeting; Dave Pummel seconded; motion carried.
- 5. Approval of February Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer David Pummel stated that the income for the month was very close to that of last year's, as was the year to date income, but since we increased the budget for 2023, we are behind. When figuring in the expenses for the month, we are at \$8,500 less than budgeted. Utilities were higher, since February was a cold month. The month had four Sundays, and we couldn't meet on Ash Wednesday, so we had fewer chances to receive offerings. We received the snow removal bill, which we will pay next month, so if you have been praying for snow, please stop. Deming Haugland moved to approve the February treasurer's report; Christopher Egerdahl seconded; motion carried.

6. Ministerial Staff Reports: Deacon Laura Campbell reported that she has a few spots open yet for the Lenten Devotions. Centering Prayer is going well, and the four weeks scheduled this Lenten season may not be enough. Fifteen people from OSLC and other churches have attended faithfully. On the Saturday before Easter at 7:30 PM, we will observe a shortened form of Easter Vigil, starting by a fire in the parking lot and moving inside by the baptismal font.

Pastor Stephan Sandness officiated two funerals today: one at National Cemetery and the other for Bart Willuweit. It was a hard day. He has some weddings coming up, and he has started meeting with the couples. Lent is his focus right now. At the Wednesday services, he's been using videos to help tell the Bible story he will share at the Sunday service. Confirmation classes will now be for the 8<sup>th</sup> graders exclusively as they prepare for each step toward their Confirmation. It is the season of transition. Last Sunday, he attended the Bear Butte Conference. It was good to see colleagues. On the weekend, he will travel to Minnesota to visit his mother and other family members.

#### 7. Committee Updates:

Mission Team will host the Wednesday Supper on March 15 to support the Woyatan Bus, which is a way that the church in Rapid City helps the homeless have a warm place to be with soup and safety on a cold night. On March 22, we will host the Wednesday Supper to raise money for Outlaw Ranch campers, and on the 29<sup>th</sup>, we will sponsor a diaper drive for Pine Ridge. We received three thank you cards for our donations in January. Property Team: The team has been looking over the church building and has found areas that need attention. The building has shifted which has caused windows to be less sealed to the outside world. The overhang at the front of the church has water getting into it, which will need to be addressed to find out the cause and solution. Some lights in the Fellowship Hall need to be replaced, and the discussion centered on whether we should replace all the lights with LEDs at one time. Stewardship: Members of the team plan to use Temple Talks to inform the congregation of their mission.

### **Welcome Center Hosts (2):**

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

### Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

#### Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

#### Snack providers (4):

Bring 4 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

### Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
