love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. John 21:15 – 17

Shortly after Jesus rose from the grave, according to John's Gospel, he showed up on the beach of the Sea of Tiberius where the disciples had reverted to their old lives as fishermen. They went fishing?! Of course they did. They were guys. What else do you do when you don't know what to do? You go fishing. Makes perfect sense.

Of course, Jesus had bigger plans for them than this... a more urgent mission. It's on that beach that he asks Peter where his priorities lay. "Do you love me?" Jesus asks. "Yes Lord; you know that I love you." "Feed my lambs." Jesus says... "Tend my sheep...feed my sheep."

Much can be, and has been, made of that imperative laid at Peter's feet. The Church's mission must be nothing less than "feeding Jesus' sheep," if indeed we love Jesus. But what, exactly, are we to feed them with? Was Jesus referring to the good news of resurrection life? Most certainly! But could it be even more basic than this...more elemental? I'm guessing yes. Trying to fill people's ears and hearts with Easter while leaving their bellies empty seems not only counter-intuitive, but downright demonic. There is a world of need at our doorstep, and we cannot ignore basic life needs while on a mission to satiate spiritual needs. It doesn't work.

The Church knows this, even if we have been, at times, slow to act on it. But we continue to try. Feeding ministries have been an integral piece of our mission and continue to be so. Here at Our Savior's, we are constantly raising up opportunities to answer Jesus' call to "feed [his] sheep," through our neighborhood food shelves, city-wide feeding ministries, school Back Pack Program, etc. The month of March was dedicated to just such efforts among us here, as all of our *Love Your Neighbor Jar* gifts were dedicated to our larger Church's efforts to address the needs of hungry people around the world through the ELCA World Hunger Appeal.

Now in April, I'd like to challenge us to come full-circle, as it were, and along with our feeding ministries lift up the opportunity to make sure folks are fed with the Word as well. For the last eight years or so, our Campus Ministry at Black Hills State University, located in our "Living Room" building at the corner of Jackson and Yale, has been hosting college students for weekly meals and faith exploration. We're currently in a time of transition as we search for a new permanent Campus minister, but the dinner-church program continues.

Looking forward in hopes of strengthening that ministry, along with our high-school ministry and Young Adult study group that meets there, we've had to do some re-model to the exterior of The Living Room. A generous matching gift has been given, and we're close to having the project completed. We have about \$10,000 left to raise. So here's the pitch:





Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 4 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
