Dear Friends.

It's been the pattern here, as in many congregations throughout the land, to take this time of year as an opportunity to talk about things financial, usually on the occasion of the dreaded "Stewardship" or "Consecration" Sunday. While well-intentioned, I've always felt a little hinky about the whole deal. Here's why:

"Stewardship" is often a dirty word among church folk. Upon hearing the word uttered, particularly if uttered by clergy or Council Presidents or Board Chairs, folks grab for their wallets and hold on tight. Maybe that's because "stewardship" has become synonymous with "fund drive" and making the budget. The very notion of Christian stewardship has become soaked with feelings of obligation at best and guilt at worst. I wonder if it can be reclaimed.

In the Biblical story, from the very beginning God creates human beings as stewards (caretakers) of the created realm. "God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth." (Genesis 1:28) Having "dominion" implies responsibility and care for. That responsibility and care is born of the fact that God made it... it belongs to God... and has been placed into our hands as a trust. It's the basic understanding of the life we have, all of it. Life is a gift. The world is a gift. What we have in and of ourselves is all gift from God's creative and generous hands. Out of gratitude, we take care of it. That's stewardship.

How we care for our congregation, for our community and for the world is a response to God's grace, plain and simple. Out of thanks for such gifts, we care for them. Thankful hearts are caring and generous hearts.

Who are the most generous persons you know? Think about them... who they are and how they approach life. To a person, my role-models for generosity have one thing in common: they exude gratitude! They're thankful... thankful for life, for love, and for opportunities to share their own. They don't act out of obligation or guilt. They just sense blessing, and they want to share it.

Understanding that generosity is born of gratitude, I've been thinking that perhaps gratitude is where I should begin (as pastor), and where the elected leadership of this congregation ought to begin as we head into a new year soon.

On Sunday, November 13, the Church Council put forward a Mission Plan (budget) for 2023 that is in the neighborhood of 10% over the previous year's plan. While that might appear aggressive on its face, the bulk of the increase is simply an acknowledgement of inflation and increased costs.

The plan was passed unanimously by the congregation present at that meeting. That's worth repeating: *The plan was passed unanimously by the congregation present at that meeting.*

And *that's* why we're not asking anyone to fill out an "Intent of Giving" Card for this next year.

It might sound counter-intuitive, but it's really quite simple: The spirit of this place, of you people, has historically been to rise to the challenges put before us. We don't need your signature on a card. We need your enthusiasm and openness for where God is leading us in the new year. For the gift that is you, and for the partnership that we share, I am grateful... our leadership is grateful. Thank-You for that gift!

The Apostle Paul, in his first letter to the Thessalonians, encourages Christians to "give thanks in all circumstances." Lord knows, it's easier to give thanks in some circumstances than in others. It's easier to be grateful when everything's going great in our lives. It's easier to be generous when we're feeling flush. And yet, we know Paul was on to something. Being surprised by gratitude for blessings found even in the midst of the mess of some awful experience, some challenging difficulty or while going through some painful thing... it's powerful when it happens, and amazing that it actually does happen. But that is precisely where we discover grace all over again, and we can't help but share it.

Christmas Eve Music Wanted



The four weeks of the season of Advent are among my favorite in the church year. This time of waiting and preparation for the Christ child's birth lead us to the celebration at Christmas.

In our American culture, Christmas preparations are certainly common in these weeks; but waiting is definitely counter-cultural. Instant gratification is the reality of our daily life. So this time of waiting takes intention and adjustment. I'm thinking especially about music. In worship, we sing Advent hymns during these four weeks—not Christmas music that we hear on the street or may be listening to at home starting the day after Thanksgiving. Some of our familiar Advent hymns are *O Come*, *O Come Emmanuel* and *Come Thou Long-Expected Jesus*. In the last years, *Joy to the World* was thankfully added to the list! Other hymns not so familiar that you may want to check out are *Wait for the Lord* and *All Earth is Hopeful*.

As Christians, during this season of Advent we also await Jesus' coming again in majesty someday. The hymn *The King Shall Come* reflects that broad view. An edgier song that I particularly enjoy is *The Days Are Coming* by *Tangled Blue*. It reflects the prophetic verse from Jeremiah 23:5. Or listen to their version of an end-time Advent song which is also in our worship hymnal, *Lo, He Comes With Clouds Descending*. Crispy Roasted Rosemary Sweet Potatoes



Ingredients

- 3 Tablespoons butter, melted
- 3 Tablespoons olive oil
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed dried rosemary, or 1/2 tsp. fresh
- 3 lbs. 3-4 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and sliced thinly
- 1 shallot, peeled and sliced thinly
- Kosher salt and freshly cracked black pepper, to taste

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F.
- Combine melted butter, oil and crushed rosemary in a small bowl. Pour 2 tablespoons of butter-oil mixture in the bottom of a 2-quart baking dish. Arrange potato slices vertically in the dish. Add a sliver of shallot between every few slices of potato. Brush top with remaining butter-oil mixture. Season generously with salt and pepper.
- Cover dish with foil and roast for 1 hour, covered, until potatoes are tender (If your potato slices are thicker, you may need to increase cooking time). Increase oven heat to 450 degrees F. Remove foil and roast another 10-15 minutes, until tops of potatoes are browned and crisp.
- 4. Enjoy!

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, Fellowship and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 9:50 AM. Eighty-five OSLC members were in attendance.
- **2. Devotions:** Pastor Stephan opened the meeting with a prayer fitting to our times.
- 3. Approval of the Minutes of the April 18, 2022, Annual Meeting of the Congregation: Mike Overby moved to approve the minutes; Marc Stacey seconded; motion carried.
- 4. Endowment Committee Report: Lennis Larson shared information about the Endowment Fund, which was established to enhance the work of Our Savior's by funding challenges and opportunities not covered by the annual budget. As of September 30, 2022, Our Savior's has endowments with: ELCA Pooled Investment - \$100,521.30, Thrivent's InFaith - \$75,815.42, and Endowment Scholarship Fund Savings Account at First Interstate Bank -\$18,471.22. The Endowment Fund provides OSLC students who attend Lutheran colleges with a scholarship. Gabe Knudson and Amelia Klug each received a \$1,000 scholarship to attend Augustana this year. Lennis reminded the congregation, they should consider the OSLC Endowment Fund in their special gift giving.
- 5. Updated Treasurer's Report: David Pummel reported that we have not reached our Annual Budget goal of \$578,862 this year, but our actual income has been more than our actual expenses to put us \$1,628 ahead to date, so we are in a good position going into the final two months of the year. We have assets of \$80,657.31 in a CD, and we have a healthy Endowment Fund.
- 6. Vote on the Proposed 2023 Budget: David Pummel showed the congregation the history of the budgets for OSLC, and each budget increase had aligned with the inflation percentage of that year. Following that historical view, the budget for 2023 was created at a 10.36% increase. Notable changes from the 2022 budget to the 2023 budget are an 8% increase in all staff compensation, benefits added to Office Assistant's compensation, the hiring of Nursery Attendants during services, and a 30% increase in snow removal costs. The Council felt that since we have a good financial situation, this is a good budget proposal. Helen Merriman moved to approve the 2023 budget proposal; Mike Konstant seconded; motion carried.

- 7. Election of Nominating Committee: Three people from the congregation volunteered to be on the nominating committee: Mike Overby, Pam Englund, and Sara Miles. Two people from the Church Council will complete the nominating committee following the December Council Meeting.
- 8. Property Improvement Updates: Pastor Stephan shared updates that are completed or ongoing. The new AC unit for the sanctuary was installed in the Spring. The Fix-It group worked outside the building to remove overgrown plants and will continue with landscaping in 2023. The Living Room will need improvements in the future.
- **9.** Adjourn and Closing Prayer: Andy Binder adjourned the meeting at 10:11 AM, and Pastor Stephan closed the meeting with a prayer expressing the idea that "We should not be weary in doing what is right" and asked that God be with us.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:38 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Andy Binder, Nichole Braithwait, Christopher Egerdahl, Deming Haugland, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Christina Miles, Mat Ornelas, David Pummel, and Pam Tyma.
- 2. Devotions: Deming Haugland shared a devotion based on gratitude. He asked us to think about how often we ask "please" in our prayers compared to how often we say "thank you." He said we could often flip our view around. Instead of asking God to "please" help us, we could say "thank you" to God for the value of the problems we face.
- **3. Approve Agenda:** Christina Miles moved to approve the agenda; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
- 4. Approval of the October Council Minutes: David Pummel moved to approve the minutes of the October meeting; Nichole Braithwait seconded; motion carried.
- 5. Approval of the October Treasurer's Reports: David Pummel said OSLC is \$2,200 ahead of where we were last year at this time. He also stated that our expenses are somewhat ahead, but we are still in a good spot going forward to the end of the year. Pastor Stephan shared that Lisa needs a new computer, and rather than wait until next year, we could use the Thrivent Choice Dollars we have to buy it. The Council agreed to order the computer now. Mat Ornelas moved to approve the October treasurer's report; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.

6. Ministerial Staff Reports:

Pastor Stephan Sandness served as Chaplin for a First Call Retreat for pastors who are in their first three years of service. About two dozen pastors and the bishop were there. He also talked about the Listen/Learn/Care discussion at the South Canyon Church. Participants learned about the work of the Synod: how the leaders listened and then developed the path forward, naming it Journeying Together in Christ. Wedding season has ended for 2022. He shared that OSLC had more baptisms than funerals this year. The last two months of the year will be very busy for the church staff with special events and high holy days. Advent devotionals have been ordered.

Deacon Laura Campbell reflected on how November leads her to feel so grateful. Her book study group is reading Grateful by Diana Butler Bass and discussing the topic together. Twelve new families will be received in worship services on November 13 after sharing a meal together as a group with their sponsors on the evening of November 10. The prayer and healing service on October 26 was well attended. Nick and Abi Case sang the names of the countries of the world, with the congregational response "Peace be yours" after each grouping. The effect was humbling and beautiful. The Gather Women's Evening Bible Study and three WELCA groups are finishing up "Jesus and Nature: Teachers of Faith" three-lesson study.

7. Committee Reports:

Education: Halloween Trunk or Treat had 13 trunks and about 100 kids. Sunday and Wednesday school are preparing the Christmas program "Heaven and Nature Sing" on December 18 at the 10:45 service. Cradle Roll has added two families to the expecting list. KidZone has 24 kids registered. The 4th Graders will lead the Apostles' Creed on November 20. and the 1st Graders will make Advent wreaths and receive Bible cubes. Adult education has several groups for discussion and fellowship. Confirmation has 35 students and 4 leaders. **Mission Team** will be supporting two missionaries in 2023: one in Cameroon and one in Nicaragua. Our Wednesday Meal raised \$156, which will go toward some Spearfish school children's lunch accounts if they have fallen behind. The Angel Tree collections will begin with gift cards for Pine Ridge children. Donations for the gift cards will be collected on November 13 and 20th. Any amount can be donated, but the cards will be purchased as \$25 gift cards. The Angel Tree itself will have its angels available on November 27 and December 4. **Senior Ministry** is planning a Christmas party for December 8.

Property: The overgrown bushes in front of the church have been pulled out, thanks to Jim Benning. The Fix-It group, an energetic group who meet on Tuesday mornings to look for things that need to be done; they find problems that need to be fixed before anyone else knows there's a problem. Pastor Stephan praised their service to OSLC.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 6 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
