But Jesus answered, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.""

Matthew 4:4

What *is* the church? If an alien dropped out of the sky into your kitchen while you were eating breakfast and asked you that question, how would you answer (after you choked on your Cheerios)? Lots of ways you could go with that answer, I imagine: Church is a bunch of people who get together regularly to pray and sing (one of the *only* places left in our culture where people actually sing together in public), to praise our Maker. Church is people who pray, study and learn together as they seek to follow Jesus ("disciples," in other words). Church is a "place," that building on the corner of State Street and Michigan Avenue where Christians gather to worship, celebrate, console, visit, learn, serve, etc. Church is the identifying label referring to folks who have been claimed and named by God in baptism into Jesus' death and resurrection (and then you'd have to spend awhile unpacking *that* for your alien guest!)

We could go on. However, it may be not far off the mark to assert just this one thing when we try to wrap our heads around what "church" is: Church is first and foremost, above all else, a listening community. In front of all the worshipping, praying, singing, studying, visiting, serving... we listen for God to speak. (Indeed, the sixteenth-century reformer, Martin Luther, was fond of referring to the Church as a "mundhaus," a "mouth-house" where we hear God's promises spoken.)

I wonder if listening isn't in danger of becoming a lost art. Maybe it's our world's fascination with noise and information that tempts most of us to do a lot more "sharing" than listening. After all, how can one possibly sift through the cacophony of voices banging against our ear drums to know which to listen to and which not?

On the first Sunday of Lent (just few weeks away), the Word appointed for that day has us out in the wilderness with Jesus as he's being tempted by Satan, immediately *after* his baptism and *before* he begins his public mission. The Gospel writer Matthew has the Deceiver whispering sweet nothings into Jesus' ear, and Jesus telling him to flake off, asserting that life can only be lived by listening... moment to moment, to the One who loves us.

The Church is the gathered body of believers in that same Jesus, living week to week, *one text at a time*. Each week, we immerse ourselves in a tiny part of God's Word, listening for what God might be offering us there, whether comfort, or hope, or challenge, or courage... or all of it! But we trust that in the listening, we won't be left the same. That's the promise.

This year during the 40 days of Lent I invite you to be Church in the fullest way. On each of the Wednesday evenings of Lent we'll gather in the sanctuary at 6:26 P.M., as is our custom, to worship with Holden Evening Prayer as our script for song and prayer... but primarily we'll be gathering to LISTEN to the Word from scripture for that week... to dig into it, under it and around it... to carry it with us into the weekend. We'll move through Lent the way Jesus moved through the wilderness: One text at a time.


Friendship Ministry Extending the love of Christ from Friend to Friend



Just a reminder... we have a Hearing Loop!

A Hearing Loop allows those folks with a T-Coil switch on their hearing aid to hear what's coming through the sanctuary sound system *directly*. That means no need for an extra



device or receiver. The hearing aid must have a T-Coil switch, and it must be activated for it to work with the system. If you are a wearer of hearing aids, contact your device provider for info on how your device(s) might work with the system. If you're considering hearing aids for the first time, look into getting ones with the T-Coil switch, so you can make the most of our system!

Do you know someone who needs our prayers or the comfort of a prayer shawl representing our prayers? A prayer shawl is given to anyone upon request... generally to those who are in ill health, grieving, lonely, shut in, etc.

The shawl is a tangible representation of God's love, care and comfort available to the recipient, as well as the assurance that prayer has been made on behalf of the one who receives the shawl by others...by the one making the shawl and by the whole Yarn Ministry group as the shawl gets blessed before it is given out. 

January 6, 2023 - 6:30 PM Pummel Residence

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

The meeting was called to order by Pastor Stephan Sandness. Other members present were Deacon Laura Campbell, Linda Easthouse, Deming Haugland, Cindy Koppinger, Mat Ornelas, and David Pummel.

The meeting was informal, and we did not have an agenda. Two items were discussed: Pastor Stephan's plans for sabbatical, and the financial status of OSLC at the end of 2022.

Pastor Stephan plans to go on sabbatical for the last half of May through the first half of July 2023. He's looking forward to the Festival of Homiletics, which is the best conference on preaching sermons. He plans to use his time to unplug, but also to reconnect with others. OSLC has money set aside for preachers who will cover for him while he's gone. His plans are still being formed.

David Pummel went through the Treasurer's report for December 2022, which showed a positive balance of \$6,680.23 to finish off the year. Offerings for December were almost \$80,000, and an anonymous gift of \$3,000 went a long way toward the cleanup of the water in the basement after the water heater malfunctioned. Even though we were over budget on snow removal and over budget on property insurance, the donations of the congregation put us ahead for the month. One item from last month that was finalized was the cost to repair the refrigerator in the kitchen. WELCA will donate \$1,000 to have it fixed with a new compressor, and the Church Council will kick in the rest of the cost which will come from the Repair and Replace line of the budget.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 14, 2023, at 6:30 in the Conference Room, and Christina Miles will share devotions.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 4 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.


