

An open letter to God at Christmas:

Dear God,

I'm writing to you this Christmas in hopes that this letter won't end up in the same place that most of the letters to Santa end up in the post office. It's not that I'm a skeptic... or a Scrooge... but maybe just a little jaded, and tired, and in need of a little more faith. I guess I'm writing to you rather than to Santa mainly because this, after all, was your holiday, your holy day, first... before Santa and his elves and the mall ever got a hold of it!

The thing about Christmas, Lord, which really strikes me, is how big everything seems to become around Christmas. To hear Luke tell it in your Bible, Christmas is really about how you made great things small, so that we could comprehend them. Most of the time, for me, though, it's about how I make small things so big! I take this one day on the calendar and make it the largest event of the year! No other date on the calendar comes close, especially if you're a kid (or in retail).

My expectations always seem to grow to gargantuan proportions at Christmas. Remember when I was ten, and just had to have that microscope? Or when I was thirteen and my life would be complete if only I had that .22 rifle? Or when... well, you know the rest, all of those small things that I dreamed would make all the difference in the world if only I could have them. I suppose my expectations have changed regarding Christmas, but they haven't shrunk! I still expect more contentment, more satisfaction.

Maybe this Christmas my kids will be so overjoyed at the first present they open that they'll actually forget the other packages lying under the tree, and they won't throw it into the pile as they reach for the next one. Maybe if I buy this thing for this person, it'll make up for the way I treat them, or ignore them, or take them for granted the other 364 days of the year. Somehow, Lord, I manage to put an awful big weight on one small gift.

My expectations get so big at Christmas, Lord! I expect my kids to be especially well-behaved, my wife to be a mind reader and all things familial to be sweetness and light... as long as I don't have to change my behavior much. It's not just my expectations, or my Visa card balance that gets bigger at Christmas, and you know it. For some reason, Lord, this time of year always seems to tempt me into making huge the things that ought to be small in their proper perspective.

My anxieties grow larger, as I look at my kids and wonder if I'm being the kind of parent I need to be for them. (I forget, sometimes, that with the gift of these babies you also promised me the gifts to care for them.) In the dark of late December, Lord, I get to thinking about another year gone, and the fact that I'm already this old, and what have I done with these precious years and is this where I'd imagined I'd be at this age... and it's all going by so fast!

My pains and my losses always seem more magnified this time of year, too. Lord, why is it that every loss, every failure, every shortcoming seems to grow in my consciousness at Christmas? My lost loved ones, my failed relationships, my propensity toward selfishness, my fear of weakness and old age, my lack of trust in you... I have a way of making them big to the point of overwhelming, when in fact they should be so small in light of what you've done for me and all you've given me.

I want to thank you, Lord, for Christmas and all that it means. My tendency to make small things huge isn't your fault, and all of that garbage <u>would</u> overwhelm me if not for the fact that you, in your infinite wisdom, decided to make great things small... for me.

You, the creator of all things, came into my world in the smallest of places, Bethlehem, a backwater wide-spot-in-the-road out in the middle of nowhere. You, the Ancient of Days, came to a working-man carpenter and his teenaged bride-to-be, people of no greater importance or stature than me. You showed yourself first to shepherds, men of no real social station, with the stink of the field on them. Most importantly, you wrapped your infinite self in the fragile, very mortal flesh of a baby. When you did that, coming to me in the smallest, most vulnerable form imaginable, you made it possible for me finally to receive you.

Christmas reminds me that in your coming first to the small places, there is now no place that is Godforsaken. As sure as you were found in a manger, you must also be in my kitchen, in my living room, in my office, in my car. Christmas reminds me that as sure as you came first to parents of no special station or ability, and you trusted them to raise you into adulthood, you must certainly entrust yourself to my care, too. If Joseph and Mary can bear you to the world, I must be able to do that as well.

Christmas reminds me that as sure as you first revealed yourself to a bunch of scraggly shepherds, you most certainly will reveal yourself to me, even in all of my doubts and fears. Christmas reminds me that whenever I look into the face of a baby, whenever I change a diaper, change a 'jammy or heat up a bottle, the vulnerability I see there is a reflection of the way you became vulnerable that I might receive you.

Christmas reminds me that as once you made great things small, you aren't finished yet. You have taken the grave, that small hole in the ground that I make out to be the greatest of bottomless caverns, and you've made it nothing ... but a small gateway to a life that lasts forever.

So... Thank-you, Lord Jesus, for your birth, for Christmas. Help me now to receive it, and you, with the faith of Mary and Joseph, with the wonder of the shepherds and with all of the joy of the angels, and to carry that gift into the New Year. Amen.

And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." ~ Revelation 21:5



During the Senior Ministry Christmas Party, we had a lot of requests for this recipe.

Pam Tyma's Potato Chip Cookies

- 1 lb. butter
- 1 c sugar
- 3 c flour
- 2 cups crushed potato chip (not the ruffled ones)
- 1 c chopped pecans/walnuts
- 1 t vanilla

Powdered sugar

Preheat oven 325.

Cream butter and sugar for 5 minutes. Add flour, then potato chips, then nuts, then vanilla. Shape dough into small balls (1" balls) Place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten with a fork dipped in water. Bake for 20 minutes. Cool pan on wire rack. Sift powdered sugar on top of cookies.

Yield: 7 – 8 dozen cookies

- 1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Pastor Stephan Sandness at 6:30 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Nichole Braithwait, Deming Haugland, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Mat Ornelas, David Pummel, and Pam Tyma.
- 2. **Devotions:** Nichole Braithwait started her devotion by saying that her children would be baptized during Wednesday Word on December 21. She shared how difficult it was to explain God to two young children. She shared a message from 1 Peter 1:8-9, "Without having seen him you love him; though you do not now see him you believe in him and rejoice with unutterable and exalted joy. As the outcome of your faith you obtain the salvation of your souls."
- 3. Approve Agenda: David Pummel moved to approve the agenda; Nichole Braithwait seconded; motion carried.
- 4. **Approval of the November Council Minutes:** Linda Easthouse moved to approve the minutes of the November meeting; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- 5. **Approval of the November Treasurer's Reports:** David Pummel shared the Statement of Income and Expenses with the Council. November's income was \$40,135 and the actual year-to-date income was at \$477,472. Our monthly expenditures for November were \$43,023, and our actual year-to-date expenditures were at \$478,732. Last year for November, we were showing a loss of \$10,943.83 and a year-to-date loss of \$8,873.39. The difference to this year for the month and year to date is that the property insurance was paid in November last year and will be paid in December this year because we changed companies, so once we subtract out the insurance, we are where we were last year.
- 6. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura Campbell said the New Member Orientation and Dinner went well, with 10 of the 12 new member families attending. She's grateful for the team who organizes the dinner and for people who agreed to sponsor these families. Many volunteers are providing visitation or sending cards to members of our congregation: Friendship Ministers, SonShine Squad, Communion Distribution folks, Card Ministry leaders, and more. The holidays can be a difficult time for caregivers, lonely, or grieving people. Laura and a group of five are reading the book Grateful by Diana Butler Bass, and they will get together next week and again in January to discuss it. Laura has had positive comments about receiving the Advent Devotional again. Members of the congregation appreciate everything about it: size, readings, reflections, artwork, and the fact that we all are reading the devotions together.

Pastor Stephan agreed with Laura that the New Members Orientation and Dinner was great, the best since post-Covid. In the previous months, he's officiated over six baptisms and will have two more next week; he has one funeral coming up on the Thursday before Christmas. Advent is going well, and the first unit of confirmation is finished. As usual, there will be four Christmas Eve services, and because Christmas Day is on Sunday, one service will be at 9:00 AM. New Year's Day is also on Sunday and will have a 9:00 AM service as well.

7. Committee Reports

<u>Education</u>: Due to weather conditions, the Education Committee did not meet, but the focus right now is on the Christmas Program on Sunday the 17th at the second service.

<u>Mission Team</u>: Due to weather conditions, not all the Mission Team members met, but Pam Englund and Janice Clarkson planned to go to the church on Tuesday morning to get the gifts ready for distribution, and they asked via email for any who could safely help to join them. Mission Team will meet again in January and share a report on Angel Tree 2022.

<u>Senior Ministry</u> had their Christmas party on December 8. It was well attended with many stories told and lots of good cheer for the holidays.

<u>Property</u>: The members of the Property Team set up the Christmas trees in the sanctuary and helped get things ready for the Christmas season and Julefest. Pastor Stephan praised their service to OSLC.

- 8. **Designation of Mission Funds 2022:** One of our yearly expenses is for Mission Support. We support these entities during the year, but at the end of the year we select those who could use our extra support. The budget has \$8,652 that will go toward the selected groups. Half (\$4,326) will be given to Artemis House, a fourth (\$2,163) will be given to Lutherans Outdoors, and the last fourth (\$2,163) will be given to the ministries at Pine Ridge. Pam Tyma moved that the Mission Support funds be divided in this way to the three entities; Linda Easthouse seconded; motion carried.
- 9. Adjourn: Before we adjourned, Pastor Stephan told us that the compressor in the big refrigerator in the kitchen was going out. To fix it would cost \$2,200 and to replace it would cost \$4,400. Since the refrigerator is good in every other way, fixing it seemed to be the logical choice. Decisions about how to pay for it will be discussed with WELCA. The meeting adjourned at 7:08 PM, ending with the Lord's Prayer. The next Church Council meeting will be January 6, 2023, for a potluck at the home of David and Kellie Pummel at 6:30 PM.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 6 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
