Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

(Mark 8:31-32)

Are you a financial investor? Probably, even if you don't think of yourself as such. You don't have to be an accounting wizard or some kind of fancy-pants billionaire. You just have to have resources of some kind that you'd like to put toward some vision of a future you imagine for yourself.

If you've ever bought into a whole or universal life insurance policy or put money into an HSA, IRA, 401k or 403b... if you have some small brokerage account or have put funds into a Money Market account, or even opened a simple savings account with the local bank... you're an investor. And when you opened up said investment account, you were no doubt provided with something called a "prospectus" that in the most complicated way imaginable tried to spell out the potential risks and benefits you may be subjecting yourself to by investing in that vehicle. A prospectus usually makes for the type of reading that could put an insomniac into a coma. (Not exactly scintillating stuff.)

However, the upshot of nearly every such prospectus is to make you, the potential investor, aware of the possibilities of what you could stand to lose, and the unguaranteed nature of what you stand to gain. This is so you can't sue the pants off the outfit that manages the fund if things don't work out as you planned. The higher the risk, the higher the potential gains (and the steeper the potential losses.)

But here's a funny thing about the human brain (and by human brain, I mean my brain): In the uncertainty of the prospectus, my hopeful, greedy little nature tends to glom on to the potential *upsides* of an investment while downplaying the potential losses. Even though the prospectus spells out in painfully boring but clear detail how past performance is no guarantee of future gains, I still tend to downplay the nightmarish risks for the happy daydreams of the potential reward. If you don't think the human brain works this way, I'd like to introduce you to a place called Deadwood... or Vegas.

I've noticed a distinctly different dynamic at play, however, when the "prospectus," as it were, exchanges uncertainty for a pretty solid guarantee.

Case in point: Chapter 8 verse 31 from Mark's Gospel is commonly referred to among Biblical scholars as Jesus' first "passion prediction" in Mark's telling of the story. It's Jesus predicting

what's going to become of him, and very soon, after he and his disciples leave the north country of Caesarea Philippi and start heading south towards Jerusalem: "the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again." He's not saying it could happen, or might happen, but that it's happening.

And here's the thing: we almost always glom onto the *first* part and seem to ignore the second. The very fact that we call this a "Passion prediction..." a prediction of suffering and death, says a lot. That seems to be pretty much all Peter heard. After all, he rebuked Jesus for it! He, and often we, only see the *cost* in Jesus' certainty.

But maybe it's the second part we should be paying the most attention to: "and after three days rise again." As certain as Jesus sounds about the realities of what loving the way he loves will cost him (and us, should we choose to follow) he seems every bit as certain about the final payout. New life. Resurrection.

In every one of Jesus' "passion predictions" in Mark's Gospel (there are three of them... 8:31, 9:31 and 10:33-34) he ends by guaranteeing his resurrection. Perhaps these aren't nearly so much predictions of suffering as they are guarantees of the new life that awaits him and all who would allow brave, unselfish, unconditional love to have its way through them. He said:

"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, **will save it**."

This is the prospectus he gives us and any who would like to consider investing themselves in his way of being in the world. And it's about as solid a deal as you're ever gonna find because, as we know... "Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed!"

February 13, 2024 - 6:30 PM

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:30pm. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Mike Steffen, Nichole Braithwait, Sherry Kloeckl, David Pummel, Christina Miles, Deming Haugland and Brady Harr.
- 2. Devotions: Brady talked about the Lenten season and Ash Wednesday and what this time of year means to him. His year has been a whirl wind and he has had a personal journey looking for ways to be involved with the church and has found a way through young adult bible study. He explained to the council that through his journey he often felt an "internal reverent humming" this energy that we can often feel as we pause and listen for God. That hum is an eternal gift. From ashes we are born and to ashes we will return. How are you using the life you were given? Are you listening to the hum? How will you allow yourself to grow through Him?
- **3. Approve Agenda:** Deming Haugland made a motion to approve the agenda. Brady Harr seconded; motion carried.
- **4. Approval of the January Council Minutes**: Christina Miles moved to approve the meeting minutes. Mike Steffen seconded; motion carried.
- 5. Approval of the January Treasurer's Report: David Pummel reported that year to date, we are starting out just fine. We finished the month at \$43,000 compared to \$54,000 last year. Noted that last year, January had five Sundays. This year we anticipate making that up in March, with five Sundays. Additionally, there was a double payment on Pastor Stephan's HSA that will even out by March. Also noted was the emergency \$3,000 that was donated to Woyatan to help with expenses of their outreach bus during the frigid temps we had in January. Finally, noted were routine expenses for the fire extinguishers and hood vent in the kitchen. Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the January treasurer's report; Nichole Braithwait seconded; motion carried.
- **6. Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura passed on that Friendship Ministers enjoyed a speaker at their January meeting. Brianne Edwards spoke about her book, A Thousand Pounds. She told her story of grief at the death of a child and what she learned about accompanying those who grieve. A copy of her book will be placed in the church library. Two new Friendship Ministers are in the process of training. Centering Prayer will begin on Tuesday, February 27, 12:15-12:45pm in the church sanctuary. This is an ecumenical group open to all. It will continue March 5, 12, and 19. Two of our members will travel to Guatemala with "Sharing the Dream" on Sunday, February 18. Please keep them in prayer! Thank you to Council members for handling the responsibility for Sunday offerings following each worship service.
 - Pastor Stephan passed on that Lent starts on Wednesday, February 14 with two services that are historically both very well attended. There are going to be Lenten Lunches available to attend on Wednesdays at the United Methodist Church in Spearfish at noon. Soup and sandwiches are available along with a 28-minute devotional. Additionally, he passed on short notes from his time at Outlaw Ranch for the Bear Butte Conference and Retreat mentioning that there have been many transitions and changes with colleagues and the churches they are serving. Discussion returned to Lent, and he asked us all to ponder our own "wilderness." Jesus was tested in the wilderness, led there by the Spirit to be tempted by the devil. Jesus refused temptation and Satan was defeated. This time of year, is our waiting space for what is new, and we are encouraged to reflect on our current "wilderness." Finally, he passed on that he is thankful for the slow down with funerals and is happy to report that he has booked his first wedding of the year.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 4 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
