Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Treasurer's Update Year Ending 2011

To the Members of Our Savior's Lutheran Church,

On behalf of Church Council I would like to provide the congregation with an update on our 2011 financials. Although we did not meet our budgeted income for the year, I am happy to report that we underspent what we did bring in. As a congregation we were able to pay out all Mission monies budgeted for the year 2011 which totaled \$9,975! This would not have been possible without the conservative mindset that all of the committee heads had throughout the year. Thank you! At the end of the year, Council placed the surplus of \$4,711 into a dedicated account, Repair/Replacement.

Currently finance committee is working on the possibility of refinancing the mortgage and will provide an update when a decision is made. We are looking at multiple options and are looking to do what's best for this congregation.

I would like to thank all members of this congregation for their dedication and support through 2011 and years to come. If you have any further questions please feel free to contact a member of council. We are here for you and glad to help.

Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

January 10, 2012 6:30pm

Church Council met Tuesday, January 10 in the church conference room. Sue Konstant, representing the Good Shepherd Clinic, started out the meeting thanking Council and Our Savior's for our continued support of the clinic. Following her brief update on the clinic, Karen Otterberg led the group in devotions.

Council treasurer, Eric Skavang, reported that even though offerings were down throughout 2011, we only received 95% of what was budgeted, we under spent for the year and were able to end the year in the black. After paying out approximately \$10,000 to Mission Support, we ended with a balance of about \$4000. Those funds will go in to the designated fund of Repair and Replacement. Eric also reported that Pastor Arley's salary will be paid from of the Senior Pastor's budget.

As per requested at the Semi-Annual Meeting of the Congregational, Eric did some research on refinancing Our Savior's mortgage. At the time of the meeting, he had received information from Thrivent Financial on what they could offer at a lower interest rate. One option was a rate of 4.75% for a 7 year adjustable loan. The second option was a rate of 4.375% for a 5 year fixed loan. The second option would raise the mortgage payment by almost \$1000 a month but would save us in interest fees over the term of the loan. Council members had questions concerning both options so Eric will do more research as well as check with a couple local banks to see what they might be able to offer us.

Lennis Larson informed the group that the synod office has put the word out that we are in need of a full time interim pastor. At the time of the Council meeting, there had been no responses to the notification.

Council members approved pay outs for Mission Support. The Artemis House, Salvation Army, Back Pack for Kids Program and the Cornerstone Mission will each receive \$275 from the Local Missions budget. Our Mission Partners, Lutherans Outdoors, Lutheran Social Services, Woyatan, Lakota Shared Ministries and St. Dymas will each receive \$1145. \$2000 in Global Mission funds were evenly divided between ELCA World Hunger and the ELCA Malaria Campaign. Considering how tight the budget was for 2011, Council was pleased to be able to approve these pay outs.

Before adjourning for the evening, council members were reminded of the potluck Church Council Christmas/Epiphany Celebration hosted by Beth Nielsen Sunday, January 22. January's meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting will be Tuesday, February 14.

Taking a Leap of Faith

Hello friends,

This Christmas I received a card from friends, retired Colonel Joseph and Sherry Kittinger, from Orlando, Florida. It so happens that I am also reading Joe's autobiography, recently published, entitled *Come Up and Get Me*. As I read the book and enjoy the lovely Christmas greeting, Joe reminds me of faith. Why? I will tell you in a moment.

First, a scholar dissected faith one day and laid out its anatomy. Faith has three parts: *Notitia*, *Assensus*, and *Fiducia*. Faith is *Notitia*. Knowledge. Basic objective fact. The word "notice" comes from *Notitia*. Faith does not begin with emotion. Its basis is agreement, affirmation. We ratify. We approve, we concur. *Assensus*. Yes. Faith is *fiducia*. *Fiducia* is a banking term. *Fiducia* means you have access to estates, bequests, and inheritance. So faith in the Latin is *Notitia*, *Assensus*, and *fiducia*.

But if you can't remember all that Latin, think of faith as a daring leap. Faith is leaping into the unknown but trusting to be caught and saved. One of the great leaps of faith in human history took place in 1960.

Alone in an open gondola of his balloon, 102,800 feet above the New Mexico desert, Captain Joseph W. Kitting Jr. of the United States Air Force uttered a simple prayer: "*Lord, take care of me now.*" Then he jumped. For the next four minutes and 38 seconds, the pressure-suited aeronaut fell at speeds up to 614 miles per hour. Joe's decent slowed only slightly by an experimental six foot wide stabilization parachute that kept him from going into a violent and probably fatal spin. "*I found myself on my back watching the balloon recede from me,*" he recalled. "*Earth, sky, and departing balloon revolved around me as if I were the center of the universe.*" At 17,500 feet, Kittinger's main chute deployed automatically. Nine minutes later, having shattered world records for highest ascent and longest parachute drop, he lay on a bed of grass, sand and sage – uninjured and grateful." – The Long and Lonely Leap.

"*Lord, Take care of me now.*" Wherever we go and whatever we do, let our prayer be the prayer of the leap of faith. Be encouraged by the great saints of Scripture. Immerse yourself in Hebrews 11 and then join these notables by beginning or continuing to Leap!

To Fast or Not To Fast

It is a tradition to fast or refrain from certain activities during Lent. Fasting is a tradition that is not required in scripture and therefore is not mandated by our church. However, many people find fasting to be meaningful and they say it deepens their relationship with God. Fasting can increase our understanding that we are entirely dependent upon God. Fasting can help us learn about the meaning of sacrifice as we consider Christ's sacrifice for us. Fasting can help rid distractions from our lives so we have more attention and time for spiritual growth.

Most fasts involve not eating for a certain length of time (usually one day), restricting eating to one meal a day, or avoiding a certain type of food for an extended period of time. Many young people will give up chocolate during Lent, whereas our Catholic brothers and sisters give up meat on certain days. Fasting can apply to habits other than food, too. Some people have given up bad habits or removed TV watching from their routines. All of these are good options, so long as the focus remains on spiritual growth and connection with God.

Other people chose to observe Lent through adding disciplines. Some examples of this include giving to charity, reading scripture, or starting a new prayer habit.

Whether you engage in a fast for Lent or not, you are still God's beloved child. No matter how you observe Lent this year, Christ still promises you the resurrection of Easter.

Ideas for Lenten fasts:

- * Refrain from eating on Good Friday
- * Have one uninterrupted meal with family each week (no cell phones!)
- * Give up your favorite food for all of Lent
- * Set aside \$1 each day to give to people who are hungry
- * Pray each day for an enemy
- * Set aside 15 minutes each day to read the Bible (starting with the Gospels)
- * Practice the discipline of patience with a "difficult" person in your life

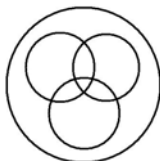
