When you’re surrounded by wonders too great and marvelous for you, the only proper thing to do is slow down and quiet one’s self, and then be open to receive far more than you imagined when you took that first step on the journey.

As we approach the week we call “Holy,” from Palm Sunday through Maundy Thursday to Good Friday to Holy Saturday, I would encourage you to think of it as a walk in the woods... and slow down. To recite once again the story of the lengths our Lord would go to reveal his love for us... this is holy ground we’re treading. To rush through it on the way to Easter would be to miss the essential mysteries that define the destination.

As part of that slow-down walk, consider joining us for worship on those days (the schedule is here in this newsletter and on our website). Quiet your soul... from the tumultuous noise that rages around us constantly... and reignite your hope in the One who is with us in all of it, leading us to far more than we seek.

We invite you to once again immerse yourself in the sacred drama of Christ's death and resurrection by joining us for worship during this holiest week of the year:



Bring your family to the Easter Vigil...




... Saturday, April 16, at sunset (8:00 pm)



Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

March 8 2021 - 6:30 PM, Conference Room

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Rod Custer at 6:34 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Andy Binder, Rod Custer, Chris Egerdahl, Dillon Haug, Deb Kimbell, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Helen Merriman, and David Pummel.
2. **What's Up?** One council member shared information about the success of the BHSU Men's Basketball Team and their upcoming tournament. Some shared the successes and information about their children. Some shared about trips and vacations. Several members are busy with work.
3. **Devotions:** Several Bible verses related to peace were read as a devotion.
4. **Approve Agenda:** David Pummel moved to approve the agenda; Chris Egerdahl seconded; motion carried.
5. **Approval of the February Council Minutes:** Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the minutes of the February meeting; Dave Pummel seconded; motion carried.
6. **Approval of February Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer David Pummel stated that February was a breakeven month; expenses exceeded income by \$51.46. The bill for the snow removal at The Living Room was paid. A \$4,200 bill for snow removal at the church for work during January and February was received. A new computer was ordered for the office. Helen Merriman moved to approve the February treasurer's report; Dillon Haug seconded; motion carried.
7. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura Campbell has worked to create videos of weekly devotionals from Grace Unbounded for Mondays through Fridays that are posted on Facebook and other platforms. Besides her participation in reading and recording a devotional each week, she has been asking OSLC members to sign-up to participate as well. Centering Prayer, held in the church sanctuary on Tuesdays, provides another faith practice for Lent. OSLC is hosting the Lenten Lunches on Wednesdays at noon. Laura is so thankful for the WELCA ladies taking on this responsibility. Faith and Care members are working to build up a substitute list.

Pastor Stephan is focused on Lent. He has also produced videos for devotion. For those interested in better understanding our faith, Pastor Stephan will offer Christian Faith through a Lutheran Lens information, discussing baptism, Holy Communion, forgiveness, and more. These discussions will be part of the Wednesday worship service and will be repeated on Sunday mornings. Wednesday services will include Holden Evening Prayer as the basis of the worship. Blayne Norrick, a senior at South Dakota School of Mines, has been found to serve as the piano player for The Joyful Journey worship team.

Beth Nielsen joined the council to discuss the creation of the "Pray Ground," a children's area available to families with children, during the worship service.

8. **Community Connection:** The Council continues its work on a strategic plan for OSLC going forward. Each month, we ask "Who do we invite from the community to help us serve the needs of our neighbors?" In an answer to this question, Jill Murphy, a counselor at Spearfish High School joined the council to share her views of the students she serves. She's been a counselor at SHS for 20 years. She said the counselors divide the students up by grade level to set up their caseload. She works more with the upper classes. Besides counseling, her work includes being part of IEP's, scheduling, and testing.

When asked about what has changed for students, she said, "Anxiety," which is seen in most students. She believes that social media plays a large part in what students are anxious about. They believe they see perfect lives on social media, and they have to try to keep up. She has seen the damage that anxiety can do, and what can happen if it isn't dealt with.

The school district recognizes that student anxiety and mental health is a problem. The school used Covid money to hire a social worker and a mental health counselor, which has been a huge help, but the Covid money is not a constant, and Murphy hopes the school district will continue to direct funds to keep this help. The health class teaches a course on "mental health first aid." The seniors

have not had that program yet. The school had a guest speaker who talked about suicide.

One thing that is true, and has been maybe forever, is that kids are mean to each other. With social media, being mean is easier, which is definitely not okay. We live in a culture of meanness. Counselors can't ask to look at a student's phone; parents need to look into what is happening to their child online.

One suggestion Murphy had that could help would be for families to find ways to have more family time. She said the students are great kids and this is a great community, but our kids are hurting. Anger, anxiety, and stress shut people down.

9. Committee Updates:

Senior Ministry had their Mardi Gras party. The Seniors enjoyed being together. They also enjoyed the gift cards that were given as Bingo prizes.

Education: Wednesday and Sunday School are going well. Lent-in-a-Bag Family Devotions were distributed to help families do things together that focus on the season of Lent. The Milestone Ministry for second graders is coming up. They will stand with Pastor Stephan on Palm Sunday to lead the Lord's Prayer during worship. KidZone is doing well.

Property Team: The HVAC system has arrived and will be installed, probably in May.

Communication: The team has realized that there is a lot of work to be done, and plans need to be made about how things will be done and who will do them.

10. Adjourn: Rod Custer adjourned the meeting at 8:00 PM. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, April 12, 2022, at 6:30 PM in the Conference Room. Rod Custer will lead devotions.
