Dear friends in Christ,

As we move into these weeks of Advent waiting and preparation for Christmas celebration, I'm wondering what makes this time especially meaningful for you? Do you or your family have favorite traditions—things that you would never consider leaving out of your preparation or celebrations?

One favorite Advent tradition of mine began in childhood in my family of origin--lighting the Advent wreath and sharing a devotional Bible reading. On Sunday evening in our farmhouse on the prairie, we would gather at the table around the homemade Advent wreath. A different person was chosen each night to ceremoniously light the candle that marked the particular week of Advent waiting. Evening light was generally dim, and the flickering light of the candles made the quiet moments of gathering unlike any other time of our year. We took turns reading from the chosen passage of Scripture—parents and children, even those just learning to read. This was unhurried time—sharing these special moments together that sometimes ended with a song and always with prayer.



APPLE FRITTERS

11/3 c. sifted flour 2 beaten eggs 1 Tbsp. sugar 2/3 c. milk 2 tsp. baking powder 1 Tbsp. salad oil 1/2 tsp. salt 3 c. small strips of apples

Sift dry ingredients together. Blend eggs, milk and salad oil; add dry ingredients all at once and mix just until moistened. Stir in apple strips. Drop from tablespoon into deep, hot oil, 375°. Fry until puffy and golden, 3-4 minutes; turn once. Drain on paper towels. While warm, sprinkle with confectioner's sugar. Serve at once. Makes 3 dozen. Is also delicious with syrup.

Semi-Annual Meeting of the Congregation

Sunday, November 14, 2021 - 9:45 AM

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, Fellowship and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Rod Custer at 9:52 AM. Seventy-six OSLC members were in attendance.
- 2. **Devotions:** Pastor Stephan opened the meeting with a prayer seeking God's presence as we work as a congregation. We are grateful for the gift of each other and God's spirit.
- 3. Approval of the Minutes of the April 18, 2021, Annual Meeting of the Congregation: Members were directed to the minutes on page one of the agenda. Annette Johnson moved to approve the minutes; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- **Endowment Committee Report:** Lennis Larson shared information about the Endowment Fund. which was established to enhance the work of Our Savior's and to fund challenges and opportunities not covered by the annual budget. The Endowment Scholarship Fund balance is \$16,051. This fund provides OSLC students who attend Lutheran colleges with a scholarship. Gretchen Blain was a recent recipient. Scholarships were also given to three counselors at Outlaw Ranch. Two ELCA Endowment Funds have balances of \$56,811 and \$67,396, and we have \$84,343 in Thrivent's InFaith Community Foundation. Lennis reminded the congregation that as they plan their special gift giving, they should consider the OSLC Endowment Fund.
- 5. Updated Treasurer's Report: David Pummel reported that we have not reached our goal for the budget this year, but our actual income income has been more than our actual expenses. Our income over expenses is \$2,070 year to date, which puts us in a good position going into the final two months of the year. We have assets of \$80,445.63 in a CD, and we have a healthy Endowment Fund.
- 6. Vote on the Proposed 2022 Budget: The budget for 2022 has been set at \$578,708, which is an increase of 3.67%. The majority of the increase will go to a five percent increase in salary and benefits for our staff and the hiring of a part-time AV technician. The Council felt that since we are in a good financial situation, this is a good budget proposal. Lonnie Haugland moved to approve the 2022 budget proposal; Arlene Hindbjorgen seconded; motion carried.
- 7. Election of Nominating Committee: Three people from the congregation volunteered to be on the nominating committee: Mike Overby, Pam Englund, and Leesa Haugland. Two people from the Church Council volunteered to complete the nominating committee: Chris Egerdahl and Andy Binder.

8. Property Improvement Updates: Pastor Stephan shared three major updates. The fundraising for the new AC unit for the sanctuary was a total success. The cost of the new unit is \$42,800, and the congregation contributed that amount in a little over three months. Duane and Connie McDonald contributed their time and materials to paint the sheds behind the church. A special thank you was extended to Andy Binder for his work on the audio/visual needs of the congregation.

Meeting Location: Fellowship Hall

9. Adjourn and Closing Prayer: Rod Custer adjourned the meeting at 10:06 AM, and Pastor Stephan closed the meeting with a prayer. He asked God to provide courage and patience as we strive to be the people, He wants us to be. He also thanked God for the blessings he has given us.

November 9, 2021 6:30pm ~ Conference Room

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Rod Custer at 6:30 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Andy Binder, Rod Custer, Christopher Egerdahl, Dillon Haug, Deb Kimbell, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Helen Merriman, David Pummel, and Pam Tyma.
- Members shared "What's on Top" concerning family, friends, coworkers, and traveling: a mix of happy and sad with ordinary days and not.
- 3. Devotions: Pastor Stephan shared the gospel text of Sunday, November 14. Jesus talks with his disciples about the "end of things." Beware that no one leads you astray. No stone will be left upon another. The text sounds like "nothing lasts forever," but Pastor Stephan stated that one thing will: God, the love of God.
- **4. Approve Agenda:** Deb Kimbell moved to approve the agenda; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
- 5. Approval of the October Council Minutes: Helen Merriman moved to approve the October council minutes; Andy Binder seconded; motion carried.
- 6. Approval of the October Treasurer's Report:
 David Pummel reported that OSLC had a good month financially in October. The income of about \$52,000 was above the budgeted amount by more than \$9,000. Year to date we are about \$2,000 income over expenses. The air conditioning unit fund has raised \$42,000 which should be enough. Deb Kimbell moved to approve the October treasurer's report; Chris Egerdahl seconded; motion carried.

7. Ministerial Staff Reports:

Pastor Stephan says he is in the "end of the year" season; the next seven weeks are full of stuff. WELCA is getting ready for Julefest, and Pastor Stephan is getting ready for Advent. Devotional booklets for Advent will be sent out, and Stephan and Laura will take turns sharing those devotions during the week, posting them on our Facebook page. Pastor Stephan will be thinking of Stewardship throughout Advent, thinking in terms of time as much as money. How can we share our talents as much as our treasures? OSLC will be welcoming eight to ten families as new members at the end of November. Pastor Stephan will be finishing up his role as principal instructor of the confirmation students, and Chris Blain will take over. Beth will be purchasing a new computer, one that will meet her needs and has already been added to the budget. Laura will be next on the new computer list.

Deacon Laura Campbell thanked the council and congregation for their kind words of appreciation and gift, and Pastor Stephan also mentioned that he enjoys reading the comments of the members of the congregation. In this season of Thanksgiving, Laura

is grateful for many things, especially, this faith community. Laura informed us that members new to a congregation are generally looking for three things: meaning, belonging, and purpose. She challenges current members to also think about these three things, and she will give you an opportunity to note those thoughts. Faith and Care signup is improving, and the group is thinking about providing a tutorial station during Sunday morning fellowship to show how it is done. Adult Ed on Sunday mornings in October were stand alone topics, and she may continue with that format through the calendar year.

8. Community Connection: Pat Rotert was unable to meet with the council but plans to attend the December meeting.

9. Committee Updates

Education: KidZone met for the first time. It went well. Beth has good volunteers from the Key Club at the high school. The next milestone ministry event will be the Bible cubes of the Nativity story. A volunteer has come forward to play music for the Children's Program on December 19.

Mission Team will be working on the Angel Tree for the from now until December 15.

Communication: The team met with someone knowledgeable about communication inside an organization and sharing news outside the organization. The team is working to create a magazine style communication to share "our story" within and without OSLC. It may be a quarterly publication or fewer. It is still very much in the planning stage. Our current newsletter reaches about 660 households.

Senior Ministry will be hosting the Christmas party on December 9.

Property: The Living Room sign needs to be replaced. Two trees on the south side of the church have died and need to be removed.

- 2022 Budget Recommendation: The budget will be presented to the congregation at the Semi-Annual Meeting of the Congregation on November 14 for their approval.
- **11. Adjourn:** Rod Custer adjourned the meeting at 7:35 PM, followed by the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 14, 2021, at 6:30 PM. David Pummel will lead devotions.
