And the Spirit immediately drove Jesus out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him. Mark 1:12-13

Wilderness...

What comes to mind upon hearing that term? If you're at all an outdoor person, "wilderness" can evoke romantic visions of untamed, beautiful places where nature shines forth in unspoiled glory... a place you long to be, far away from paved streets, pollution and the throng of humanity. It's those places within our country that the U.S. Forest Service has designated as "wilderness areas," where no motorized vehicles are allowed, and access requires a little more work than usual, and you're advised to stay on the trails.

All romanticism aside, true wilderness is a bit more than that. There are no trails. True wilderness by its very definition is wild... untamed... dangerous to those who don't know it. To those who know it, it's not wilderness. At least, that seems to be how the Bible depicts it. In the scriptures, the wilderness is a place of foreboding... a place of temptation... a place where it's all too easy to lose one's way. (Just think of Israel's forty years of wandering in the wilderness in the book of Exodus, constantly tempted to forget who they were and lose their way... looking for a home!)

On the first Sunday of Lent each year, we read from scripture the story of Jesus, after his baptism, being immediately driven into the wilderness. It's there that he's met with temptation to forget who he is and to lose his way. The wilderness is where Jesus' journey begins. The rest of the story, if you look closely, is really Jesus making his way through wilderness of a different kind.

During the forty days of Lent this year, as we read stories from both Mark's and John's gospels, I'd invite us to imagine this journey as a wilderness trek. We'll be going along with Jesus through some pretty rough country... often deceptively dangerous territory. But we'll have a guide... one who has been there before; one who knows a way through it; one who is well aware of the dangerous, false trails; one packing a pretty potent First Aid kit and the ability to use it; and most importantly, one capable of taming the wilderness and making of it a garden.

It's a wild world we live in. But it needn't be for us a wilderness, a place of fear.

Join us on the Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings of Lent this year as we journey together, through the wilderness. It all starts on Ash Wednesday, February 14, and the journey continues to Good Friday on March 29. On Wednesday evenings of February 21 – March 20 we'll be using the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy as our framework for worship at 6:26 P.M. each night. So, lace up, and come along...

December's Love Your Neighbor Jar raised \$698.63 for the Spearfish Ministerial Association and \$798.04 for Missionary Support.



Gathered into One: Devotions for Lent 2024



Gathered into One provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to the Resurrection of Our Lord/Vigil of Easter (traditionally known as Holy Saturday). Devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from First Corinthians. The writers then bring their diverse voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.

Portions of First Corinthians appear in the Revised Common Lectionary during each lectionary year. The apostle Paul writes this letter to the church in Corinth after hearing of quarreling and divisions among the people. He teaches the Corinthians that each person has a unique set of gifts from the Holy Spirit, given for the common good, and reminds them that the church is the body of Christ, joined together with one bread, one cup, one baptism, one God, and one Spirit. This theme of unity amid diversity is as timely now as it was when Paul wrote to the Corinthians.

Look for these free Lenten devotional booklets to be available for pick-up on the Ushers' counter near the sanctuary doors at Our Savior's beginning February 1. 

The shawl is a tangible representation of God's love, care and comfort available to the recipient, as well as the assurance that prayer has been made on behalf of the one who receives the shawl by others...by the one making the shawl and by the whole Yarn Ministry group as the shawl gets blessed before it is given out. Please come by the church office, Monday - Friday, 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM and ask for one.

In 2023 we gave out 92 prayer shawls and 48 lap robes to individuals and those living at Garden Hills Assisted Living, Edgewood Vista Assisted Living, Sandstone Manor, Pine Ridge, and to Prairie Hills Transit. We also gave 81 knitted/crocheted hats and 23 scarves to Pine Ridge, and 21 dishcloths to new church member families.

Members of this group will receive an email link to SignUp Genius where you can volunteer for the days and times that work best for you to serve as Welcome Center Host, Usher, Communion Assistant, Snack Provider, and Coffee Server. Anyone (outside of this group) is also welcome to sign up if you wish! Email sommerlyn.mortensen@gmail.com that you want to receive the link.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the front and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 6 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie travs in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
