With that sentence, I'm imagining some of my old dearly departed aunts reacting to someone's cooking experiment that they dared to bring to the family reunion pot-luck. That pseudo-polite reaction is the classic Midwestern way of saying "What the heck could they have been thinking!" It's also my reaction to the year we just left behind us. "Well... that was different."

I hardly need to point out the preceding year's challenges, and yet they are worth noting if for no other reason than to remind us of what we've just survived: A pandemic that has stolen the lives of hundreds of thousands, sickened millions and upended life for *everyone*, not to mention bringing us the added challenges of more food insecurity, financial hardship and unemployment the likes of which we haven't seen in decades; Social unrest brought on by violence against persons of color; Political theatre that has stoked division and threatened the very foundations of our democratic republic; and all of this putting on hyper-drive the fruitless debates of reason vs. intuition, science vs. opinion and basic disagreement about what freedom looks like and what compassion looks like.

As my aunts would say, "Ufdaa."

But here's the deal: we *did* survive (at least most of us). And amazingly, the Church survived. I'm not simply referring to Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Spearfish. I mean the Church of Jesus throughout the world... it has survived, and thrived, like it always has when confronted with the realities of a hurting world and not shrinking away from the pain but entering into it. Yes, we may have had to operate a little differently, especially with regard to how/if/when we gather as a worshipping community... but we have *never* stopped being the hands and heart of Christ, no matter what. (Take a look at Deacon Laura Campbell's article in this newsletter, and you'll see what I mean!)

The new year brings its own challenges: though vaccines are coming to us even now, we're not done with this pandemic by a long sight. Changes in leadership mean uncertainty. Where will we be twelve months from now? Your guess is as good as mine. But of this I am confident: as we keep before us Jesus' invitation to share his life-renewing love with others, and look for ever-more creative ways to answer that invitation, we will do more than survive. We'll be the Church.

I love you for the innumerable ways in which you have been Christ to one-another during this last trip around the sun. Yeah, it was "different." But grace has abounded through so many of you... and that's always good.

God bless us as we venture forth onto roads as yet untraveled, and let us not grow weary...



Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

Tuesday, December 8, 2020 - 6:30 PM

Meeting Location: In-person and Online via ZOOM

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ

1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Rod Custer at 6:29. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Lee Campbell, Andy Binder, Rod Custer, Gary Dettman, Christopher Egerdahl, Dillon Haug, Deb Kimbell, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Helen Merriman, David Pummel, Kari Webb, and Dawn Wood.
2. Devotions: Helen Merriman shared a devotion about thoughtful giving and being a blessing.
3. What's on Top: Most of the council members shared information about enjoying family time, caring for family, changes in life and family, and getting ready for Christmas. One member shared a story about a missed opportunity to connect with an old friend, and then reminded us not to put off making a call or connection that otherwise might come too late.
4. Brief Explanation of Council Purpose and Procedure: Pastor Stephan welcomed the new members to the council: Andy Binder, Christopher Egerdahl, Sherry Kloeckl, and David Pummel. Each council member must choose to be on either the Finance Committee or the Personnel Committee. Pastor Stephan shared information about other committees and asked members to join a committee that interests them and be ready to report back to the council the actions and plans of that committee. He also asked the group to go through the Church Directory prayerfully and get to know names and faces of the congregation. Stephan is grateful for the council members' service to OSLC.
5. November Council Minutes: Deb Kimbell moved to approve the November minutes; Helen Merriman seconded; motion carried.
6. November Treasurer's Report: David Pummel, OSLC's new treasurer, was pleasantly surprised to see that the church was in such good shape financially while going through the pandemic. The church is \$9,774.43 ahead going into December. Pastor Stephan mentioned two expenses that are upcoming: one will be from Mission Support and another will be the need to repair the sunken and chipping concrete at the front of the church. Gary Dettman moved to approve the November Treasurer's Report; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
7. Ministerial Staff Reports: Deacon Laura Campbell reported that she is just supporting the groups that are still working and mentioned Angel Tree and Faith and Care committees.
8. COVID-19 Task Force Update: Pat Rotert and Jason Knudson joined the Council via Zoom. Pat Rotert shared that the City feels it is hard hit in the current surge. They communicate with other cities. Brookings shares data points, and the City is taking the virus seriously; there have not been outside or internal trainings, and travel has been restricted. We should all be in the cautious phase. Officers are reminded to wear a mask and to do things from a distance. Jason Knudson said the medical community is seeing a bit of a plateau, a bit of breathing room, but not an improvement. They are not doing as much testing as they would like, and they're still waiting to see if there will be more of an "after Thanksgiving surge." They don't know day-by-day whether they will have the staff they need. General primary care, such as physicals, mammograms, etc., is behind by three to four weeks. There's lots of stress and anxiety.

When asked if we should have in-person services, Pat Rotert said that he had had a meeting today with six people who work on his floor, and they met on-line, not in-person. Jason Knudson said that he did not think there had been enough improvement in Spearfish to go to in-person services.

Pastor Stephan said that a Christmas Eve service will be recorded and will be available online on Christmas Eve. However, he would still like to do something so people could have communion, maybe as communion was done during the summer, where small groups of people came into the Fellowship Hall and entered the sanctuary for the Word and communion. This may be an option for Christmas Eve.

Deb Kimbell put forward the idea of having an outdoor service where people could drive-in, sing, and have fun. After a lengthy discussion, Cindy Koppinger moved that we explore the outdoor service option; Andy Binder seconded. As this motion was discussed, Andy Binder offered to help find a venue for the event, and Rod Custer offered to help with the logistics. Pastor Stephan remarked that it should be simple, like a flash mob type of thing. The leadership could decide what to do, and the council would not need to meet to approve what would be planned. The vote was called, and the motion carried.

The council returned to the in-person services discussion, which centered around our commitment to the medical staff of Spearfish and our commitment to the community. The hospital is barely above water, and a big part of our job is to not overwhelm the system. Gary Dettman moved that all services be online through the month of December; Christopher Egerdahl seconded; motion carried. Rod Custer will record a message for the congregation to be played during the next church service about what OSLC is doing and why we're doing it.

9. Committee Updates:

Senior Ministry: Instead of the usual Christmas party, the Senior Ministry mailed ornaments and cards to the senior members to let them know we're thinking about them.

Communication: The new software for the church, Church 360, has been contacting members of the congregation to opt-in to the text messaging capabilities the church now has. Texts can be sent to communicate any updates or plans, so these members have the information in a timely manner.

Property and Fix-it: Gary Dettman shared that the Property Committee is beginning to work on the replacement of lights in some areas of the church. Replacement would be space by space, rather than having it as a big project to do all at once. Chris Egerdahl was interested to know the number of lights that will be replaced and offered to help.

Education Committee: held a drive through for Bible Cubes. The Christmas program has been recorded and is ready for streaming Sunday, December 20.

Mission Team: is working on Angel Tree, members buying and wrapping gifts. The team will meet on Tuesday, December 15, to organize the gifts and prepare for distribution.

10. **Adjourn:** Rod Custer adjourned the meeting at 8:16, which was followed by the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 12, 2020, at 6:30 PM. Sharing devotions for January will be Dillon Haug.
