

Dear Friends,

As I drove into town this morning, I took notice of the U.S. Forest Service sign indicating the present fire danger level here in the northern Hills. Predictably, it read: "Extremely High Danger." Thanks, Captain Obvious. The drought we've been in for months, coupled with the ridiculously hot temps, makes for a potentially incendiary situation. We're all praying for rain.

Some folks see summer rain as a major inconvenience... the cause of scuttled plans, delayed tee-times, postponed picnics, etc. While I, like you, have been known to curse the rain at times, especially when it seems incessant, I can still appreciate it for what it is: life itself for growing things. In other words, we need it and simply can't live without it.

As a kid, I remember regarding worship in the summer about the same way I regarded summer rain... an intrusion into an otherwise perfectly good day for fun. (What strikes me as strange, though, is that now some of my best childhood remembrances of summer include summer worship, with its more relaxed rhythms and running around the church grounds with my buddies, chasing girls we thought were cute but couldn't say that to... all invaluable training for courtship.)

Gathering together with my faith family, you, in the summer months is truly for me one of the best parts about being a pastor. (I was reminded of this the hard way last summer, as the pandemic squelched attendance and limited so much of our gatherings.) Even though I don't chase anyone around the church grounds after worship anymore (that might raise some issues) I still love the relaxed rhythms and simply being in the Divine Presence, being schooled in the art of thankfulness by people like you. To me, it is life itself for growing things... like community, care and compassion.

I just recently participated in our South Dakota Synod Assembly, as I do every year in early June. Once a year, all the congregations and other ministry partners in our Synod gather to conduct the "business" of the larger church of which we're a part. This year was kind of different, not only in that there were no major "hot-button" resolutions or elections to be considered, but mostly because it was conducted exclusively on-line, seeing as how plans for the Assembly were made long before vaccines were widely available. The bulk of our time was spent in worship together, and in hearing stories from around the synod and from our partners in mission, locally and from around the globe.

I sense that some folks participating may have wondered why we bothered with the Assembly at all, if we couldn't at least be in the same space seeing old friends and colleagues in ministry... imagining that maybe there's little reason for us to take a couple days out of our summer and spend it the way we spent it, in worship and in listening and in learning. But then again, maybe gatherings such as this are exactly the rain our larger church needs to grow into the fullness of the stature of the body of Christ.

I'm thankful for the sun, and for the warmth, the extended light and the freedom it provides us in the summer. But I'm thankful as well for the rain which slows us down, feeds us and gives the growth.

This summer, no matter where the winds blow you, I hope the Spirit of God will move you to join us in worship, where grace rains down:-)


Parking is usually hard to come by. I have not heard if they are running buses from the parking lot at the BHSU Young Center again or not. Will pass that along when I know.



Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

June 8, 2021 6:30pm

Meeting Location: Fellowship Hall

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Rod Custer at 6:31 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Andy Binder, Rod Custer, Christopher Egerdahl, Deb Kimbell via phone, Karson Klein, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Christina Miles, David Pummel, and Pam Tyma.
2. Members shared "What's on Top" in their lives: Visiting, traveling, retirement, family time, baseball and softball games, and more doctoring than desired.
3. **Devotions:** Deb Kimbell's devotion focused on worry. From Luke 12: 22-31, Do not be anxious about your life, what you should eat and drink or what you should wear. Instead, seek God's kingdom, and these things shall be yours as well. God will show you the way.
4. **Approve Agenda:** The agenda was amended to include Jake Hanson from Lutherans Outdoors. Cindy Koppinger moved to approve the agenda as amended; David Pummel seconded; motion carried.
- 4B. Jake Hanson, Director of Development for Lutherans Outdoors, visited with the council about the financial hardships the church camps have faced through the pandemic. Since OSLC has a significant history with Lutherans Outdoors, he came to us to share the plans LO has to "Keep the Campfires Burning." The Board of Directors has authorized a campaign to recover losses from having the camps closed, and Jake Hanson said that \$1.2 million needs to be raised by December 31, 2021. He is contacting the congregations served by LO to ask for their help in raising funds. Pastor Stephan said the Finance Committee will look into what we can do. Several OSLC young people are signed up to go to camp, and we believe that Bible camp helps with faith formation for young people.
5. **Approval of the May 11 Council Minutes:** The May Council Minutes were amended to include Deb Kimbell on the Finance Committee. Andy Binder moved to approve the minutes as amended; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
6. **Treasurer's Report:** David Pummel reported that income for May was \$39,300 while expenses were \$40,079. The finances of the church year-to-date are \$442.80 ahead. In the dedicated accounts, the expense of \$2,500 was a payment for the kitchen remodel. Beth Nielsen is due to have her computer replaced, so she is shopping for what she needs. Derek Hayford has been doing the lawn care for OSLC, and he has bought himself a riding lawn mower, which he will also use to mow the lawn at the church. Sherry Kloeckl moved that the church give Derek a \$200 one-time payment for his using of the riding mower on the church's lawn; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried. Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the May Treasurer's Report; Christina Miles seconded; motion carried.
7. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Pastor Stephan Sandness said that Deacon Laura is getting used to her time off during her sabbatical, and he said that he is busy with the funerals that were delayed by Covid, but also busy with weddings and funerals that are happening in the present time. He said that members are gradually coming back to in-person worship, but that about 90 to 100 members are still worshipping online. New members will be received in-person on Sunday, June 13, but some may choose to be received online. We will have pictures of our new members to share either way.

Beth Nielsen joined the council this evening to discuss the plans for Vacation Bible School (VBS). Sixteen kids have signed up for VBS, and Beth has four volunteers at this time. She will be using the ELCA World Hunger Program for VBS and the topic focuses on The Journey of Life. Looking forward to the fall, she says that she can't predict what Sunday School will actually look like. Will it be in-person, or hybrid? It's too soon to tell. More Milestone Ministries will be added to the program; second graders will work on the Lord's Prayer, while other grade levels will do other tasks to reach a milestone in their faith.

Pastor Stephan and Beth attended the Synod Assembly online, and both missed being "in the same space" with other attendees.

8. Visioning discussion: Council members worked in four groups to think about and share ideas for the vision of OSLC going forward. Each group approached the topic in a slightly different way. Many of the ideas came in question form. Should we survey the congregation to see what issues they see? Should we survey families to see what they want from Children's Ministry? Should Sunday School move to Wednesday only? How do we approach members to get volunteers and help them feel comfortable as volunteers? How do we reach out and care for people outside our doors? What are the needs we can help with in the community? Can we do more of what we are already doing? How do we engage more of the congregation to help outside our doors? How can we partner with groups already in existence? For example, The Good Shepherd Clinic partnered with a local grower to provide healthy vegetables for their clients. Who do we invite from the community, people who "see" things, to help us serve the needs of our neighbors? How do we engage the younger generation: pod casts, block parties, Theology on Tap?

9. Adjourn: Rod Custer adjourned the meeting at 8:04, followed by the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 13, 2021, at 6:30 PM. Chris Egerdahl will lead devotions.

GOOD SHEPHERD CLINIC - COMMUNITY IMPACT -

Good Shepherd Clinic has served over 6,040 patients in need and filled 11,700 prescriptions since February of 2009. Since 2017, they have been able to administer 604 immunizations to help keep our community safe. All of this has been accomplished by 65 volunteers and 15 health care professionals.

Open Monday evenings, Good Shepherd Clinic is 'staffed' on a weekly basis with a team of 12-15 medical professionals and trained volunteers with no paid positions at any level.

Since graduating from Spearfish High School in 1991, TJ Gusso has dedicated countless hours and years to youth sports in Spearfish, as well as serve on numerous non-profit boards throughout the community over the years.

Recipe Corner

Pam Tyma's Potato Chip Cookies

1 lb. butter
1 c. sugar
3 c. flour
2 c. crushed potato chips (not the ruffled chips)
1 c. chopped pecans/walnuts
1 tsp vanilla
Powdered sugar



Preheat oven to 325°. Cream butter and sugar for 5 minutes. Add flour, then potato chips, then nuts, then vanilla. Shape dough into small balls (Pam uses the smallest cookie scoop from Pampered Chef). Place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten with a fork dipped in water. Bake for 20 minutes. Cool pan on wire rack. Sift powdered sugar on top of cookies. Yield: 7-8 dozen.

Pam Tyma's Cream Puffs

Dough:

1 c. boiling water
½ c. butter
¼ tsp. salt
1 c. sifted flour
4 eggs

Filling:

1 pkg. instant vanilla
pudding
1 c. cold milk
1 c. Cool Whip, thawed
Powdered sugar

In a large sauce pan, bring water, butter, and salt to a boil. Add flour, all at once. Beat over low heat until mixture leaves sides of pan and forms a compact ball. Remove from heat; continue beating to cool slightly, about 2 min. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition; after last egg has been added, beat until mixture has a satin-like sheen. Onto a greased cookie sheet, drop a spoonful of dough about 2' apart. Bake at 375° for 30 – 50 min. (depending on size of mound), until well browned and puffed. Remove from oven. Immediately cut slit into cream puff, scoop out loose dough inside if desired. Fill cream puffs with pudding mixture. Sprinkle cream puffs with powdered sugar.
