God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. Psalms 46:1 – 3

As I sit down to write this little missive on the twenty-fourth day of May, I am once again acutely aware of time’s passage. Last Saturday was the occasion of my thirty-fourth wedding anniversary. It coincided with the day we graduated our youngest, Leith, from high school. Yesterday, Monday, May 23 we bid farewell to Laura’s mom, Jean, who succumbed to the stroke she suffered five days previous. So today, I feel a little bit caught up short... and some of that has to do with the way the rhythms of children and family, schools and schedules, work and weariness tend to keep one focused on what’s immediately in front of a person, often to the exclusion of what might be coming down the road.

Maybe you’ve heard the old maxim: “*The only constant is change.*” That’s true in spades when I look back at the last thirty-four years with my beloved. Since Laura and I were married, we’ve changed cities of residence eight times, and have called ten different houses “home.” In the first 15 years, we went from a family of two, to three, to four, to five, to six...with each addition bringing seismic shifts to the way we experienced life as family. And now with the kids all out of high-school (and three out of college!) we’re having to learn a new way of being.

Of the most challenging of all transitions would easily be the loss of one we love to death. As time marches ever forward, we know such losses will come, but we’re never quite ready when they do. So many things one took for granted in the seemingly ever-present reality of a parent are upended with their death. Our comfort must be found in the foundations that they laid in us and in the promises of a future in God’s hands.

Doing the hard work of grief and change brings plenty of anxiety, but it also calls one back to the constants, to the bed-rock, to the things that don’t change. After 34 years of marriage, though our lives look very different (and we look very different), the person who stood in front of the altar next to me is *still* standing next to me. Through all of the various changes of residence, and even through the sad good-byes, my family *still* has each other. In each congregation I’ve served, as unique and special as each has been, the same Lord Jesus Christ has been celebrated and served, and the same Holy Spirit has been present, and the same call has gone out to each to make the good news of life over death a present reality in this world.

We all have our own patterns of dealing with the changes that come at us, and they can run the gamut from uninterested acceptance to excited approval to anxiety or even anger. But the point is, change happens. Sometimes we are agents of it, sometimes unsuspecting victims. One question that’s always helped me through the many changes I’ve faced in my own life has been this: “I wonder what God might be up to in this?” It reminds me that though the earth should change, God is the one busy making all things new... and God’s love and care for me, for you and for the Church never wanes or falters.

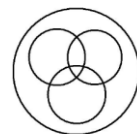

A sure sign of Summer is Festival in the Park. Our Savior's Lutheran Church will again have a pie booth. For somewhere around 36 years the congregation has provided these goodies for sale and then shared the proceeds with local charities and folks in need. Last year we helped feed the hungry through the Spearfish Community Food Pantry, provided Christmas gifts and food for children through the RED SHIRT PROJECT at BHSU and Lakota Omnicitye, and assisted a couple of folks battling cancer with travel funds.

I have been in contact with Kris and Scott Stewart. They will once again head up the pie making at the church on Thursday, July 14 at 8:00 am. Last year the "crew" made 81 pies by noon! All that is required is volunteer help. The "stations" are making pie dough, rolling out dough, mixing filling, adding dough and filling to pie tins, and "initialing" the pie with its kind of filling then baking. All ingredients and tins are provided just need willing hands!

I will have signup sheets for church pie making volunteers, home pie makers, and booth workers. A reminder for any new pie makers that we cannot use eggs or milk products to make pies due to the July heat and health safety concerns.

If you cannot volunteer to help by making pies or working the booth but would like to contribute we would welcome any "filling" you could donate. This could be rhubarb from the garden or frozen fruits and canned fruits from the store.

Pie Dough without eggs: 1/3 cup vegetable oil & enough water to bring to 1/2 cup liquid, 1 1/3 cup flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt. Use right away or dries out.

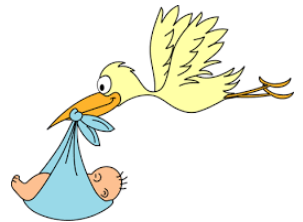

*Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with the safety pins. Gently used, clean items can be substituted for new ones. **An entire kit gets kind of expensive, single items really help as well.** Do not enclose kit in plastic bags.*

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

Welcoming children in worship is important for a variety of reasons: children are spiritual; children learn through modeling, intergenerational worship is meaningful for all ages, and more. Including children in worship allows them the opportunity to be fully engaged in the community. In a culture where age separation is prevalent, encouraging all ages to worship together is a way to reflect the Kingdom of God.

At Our Savior's Lutheran, as Jesus did, we welcome children of all ages as integral members of the body of Christ, and we welcome the sounds and activity that accompany them in worship!

Along those lines, soon you will see a new area in our sanctuary, called the 'Pray-Ground'; which is a space off to the side in the front that is intended especially for families with infants and toddlers.



We know that small children are often more engaged when they can see what is going on. Before long, little ones will start to notice the movements and rhythms of worship happening all around them. Parents are with them in the Parents Pew nearby to supervise and attend to their needs. Small tables and chairs, baby bouncers and seats, and soft toys help to keep our littlest ones occupied.

In addition to the Pray-Ground, we provide busy bags for readers & non-readers, and our nursery is available for parents to use with little ones that just need to take a break.

On Sunday, May 1, our 10:45 AM worship service was filled with statements of Christian faith, as the eighth graders completed their two years of confirmation instruction.



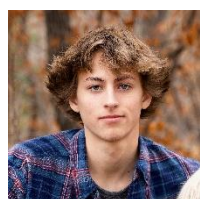

Recipe Corner



Super Easy Calzones

Ingredients:

1- 1lb. bag frozen pizza dough, thawed
1 (6 oz.) pkg. pepperoni, chopped
1 cup Ricotta
1 c. shredded Mozzarella
2 Tbs. olive oil
1 (16 oz.) jar pasta sauce, such as marinara
Grated Parmesan

Directions:

Heat oven to 400°. Cut the dough into quarters and shape into 4 balls. Set aside. In a medium bowl, mix the pepperoni, Ricotta, and Mozzarella. Roll or pull each ball into a 7-inch circle. Spoon ¼ of the pepperoni filling onto the center of each. Fold over and pinch the edges together. Place on a baking sheet and brush with the oil. Bake for 30 minutes, or until golden. Meanwhile, heat the sauce, then spoon it over the calzones. Top with the Parmesan. (Nice for busy Moms!)
