At the same time, it's that newness that can be such a source of anxiousness as the familiar gets left in the rearview and one never knows for certain what might be around the next bend or the next mile marker. That which brings excitement also has a tendency to cause tummy trouble.

We just came through a season of marking milestones here at OSLC for some of our students: Confirmation for our 8th graders and recognition of our high school graduates. Big changes coming for them, moving into new phases of their lives, taking them down new roads. My own daughter, Becca, just finished up grad school at the University of Minnesota... and is now planning a wedding. New phases, new roads. My youngest daughter, Karin, is presently in London, England with some girlfriends... her first-ever trip outside the confines of the United States. New phases, new roads.

But this is life. It's never static. Most of us have lived enough life now to know that itinerancy is part of the deal. Throughout the Biblical story, the people of God are portrayed as a people on the move... a people whose only true, solid “home” is their relationship with the One who calls, leads and sustains them. Why should we expect more permanence than they?

Indeed... but it's still hard. Life “on the road” means having to trust in a divine navigator when roadmaps for one's life seem obtuse at best, or sometimes seem nonexistent.

So, in this season of graduations and commencements, vacations and road trips, leave-taking and arriving, endings and beginnings... for those of you “hitting the road” now, whatever that means for you... I pray for you safe travels. More than that, I pray courage and an open-eyed enthusiasm for where the road is taking you. And watch your blind spots.

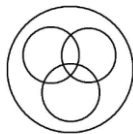
“Where there is no vision, the people perish.” ~ Proverbs 29:18

1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Pastor Stephan Sandness at 6:00 PM. Members present were Karson Klein, Sherry Kloeckl, Deming Haugland, Brady Harr, Laura Bosworth, Lana Main, Pam Tyma, Dave Pummel, Andy Binder, Pastor Stephen Sandness, and Deacon Laura Campbell.
2. **Introductions & What's On Top:** Members introduced themselves and shared a little about what is going on in their lives currently.
3. **Devotions:** Pastor Stephen Sandness shared a devotional reading and thoughts from the book, "The Word for Every Day" by Alvin N. Rogness.
4. **Church Council Overview:** Pastor Stephan Sandness shared a general overview of the church council, its functions, structure, and overall intent.
5. **Approve Agenda:** The agenda was amended to add item 11a "The Living Room Shed" and item 11b "Fellowship Hall Chairs." Pam Tyma moved to approve the amended agenda; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
6. **Action Item – Election of Officers:** Officer elections were conducted with the following roles elected.

9. **Action Item – Approval of Minutes for April Council, & Annual Meetings:**
Karson Klein moved to approve the April 8 council meeting minutes; Dave Pummel seconded; motion carried. Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the April 13 annual meeting minutes; Deming Haugland second; motion carried.
10. **Action Item – Treasurer's Report for April:** Treasurer Dave Pummel presented the treasurer's report provided. April income was \$50,351.74 with expenses of \$51,346.84. Year-to-date income sits at \$224,376.47 with expenses of \$208,831.18. Entering the summer months [traditionally lower giving is seen in summer] with a surplus of \$15,545.29. The budget and financial report were reviewed to ensure our new and old council members understand how to read them. Pam Tyma moved to approve the treasurer's report as presented; Brady Harr seconded; motion carried.
11. **Info Item – Committee Reports:** Senior Committee just wrapped up their senior May Day basket project having presented 97 May Day baskets to our seniors. The committee is now preparing for the June "Garden Party" picnic in the park. The Education Committee is winding down after the past few weeks push through Confirmation Sunday, High School Senior Breakfast, and more. The Mission Team is preparing for the Cloth-A-Kid project coming up in June. Pastor Stephan Sandness shared a thank you note and certificate received from ELCA World Hunger & Lutheran Disaster Response recognizing OSLC Spearfish as "one of the ELCA's Most Generous Congregations to their efforts."
- 11a. **Action Item – The Living Room Shed:** The Fix-It crew has noted the red shed at The Living Room is no longer needed and difficult to maintain. The Fix-It Crew is currently unsure if the shed is even worth selling, they will be looking at the footings for rot soon. Lana Main moved to give the Fix-It Crew freedom to sell, giveaway, or destroy the shed as they deem appropriate; Deming Haugland seconded; motion carried.
