

...O LORD, we wait for you; your name and your renown are the soul's desire. Isaiah 26:8

We spend a lot of our time waiting, don't we? In the lobby of the doctor's office (and then again in the exam room), on line at Wal-Mart or the County Courthouse... for that phone call or a response to that e-mail or text. We wait for this stupid pandemic to run its course and achieve "herd immunity." We wait for the show to start. We wait for the power to be restored and for the lights and the furnace to come back on. We wait for everyone to get their butts out of the house and into the car (*"for crying out loud!"*) so we can get going! We wait for that date to finally roll around. We wait for that package to arrive. (If you happen to be in charge of getting out church communications, you wait for the pastor to get it in gear and finally get his article in so the Newsletter can get printed and sent out. Yeah... chill... I'm working on it.)

During the Church year, we most often talk about waiting during the season of Advent, leading up to Christmas. We speak of being a people who wait for God's revealing in the birth of Jesus, the manifestation of divine love. It's easy to think on those themes during December, with its anticipation of a celebration coming. But what of Lent, this season of self-examination and penitence we find ourselves in presently? Is not this, in a sense, the season of our most active waiting?

These thoughts crossed my mind this last week as I received the hoped-for email from the South Dakota Game and Fish telling me that I and my son Leith were successful in this year's turkey license draw. A month and a half of waiting now ensues... the longest month and a half of the year for a turkey chaser! But it's not just a 45-day period of waiting. It's time to get ready, to prepare for mornings afield, watching for sunrise and listening for the gobbles of toms on the roost and then the soft clucks of hens moving to feeding areas. It's time to assemble gear, to sight-in, to practice making the sounds of a love-sick turkey on slate, box and diaphragm calls. In short, it's never enough to just wait. The wait is an opportunity to prepare. *The wait is a gift in and of itself.*

As church, as God's people, we wait: we wait for light (Isaiah 59:9); we wait for justice (Isaiah 59:11); we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies (Romans 8:23); we wait with patience (Romans 8:25); we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home (2 Peter 3:13); we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ. He it is who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds (Titus 2:13-14). Each of those references suggests an "active waiting," not sitting on our hands and pining away, but participating in the very thing for which we wait by getting ourselves ready to receive it. We wait for justice by *doing* justice. We wait for light by *being* light. We wait for adoption by *living as people who understand themselves to belong to God already!* See?

During these days of Lent, we await every promise that Easter brings: life out of death, hope out of despair; gain out of loss. We are called to use this season as a time to take an honest look at ourselves, our lives and priorities, and get ready to move into a new reality. It's not enough to gussy-up the old life. There must be a leaving behind of what *was* for the sake of what *could be*... of what *will be*. This is not easy stuff, and there is always some sorrow in transformation. And yet... and yet we await newness, re-birth... the best that God intends for all people!

And so I pray blessings on *your* Lenten journey this year... and I join you in the wait. God give us not only patience, but also the power and the courage to wait actively!

In March, I always think of WIND. Perhaps because I grew up on the prairie where the winds that always blew seemed normal, inconsequential almost. But in March the wind could be fiercely felt and heard! We celebrated it by coloring pictures of kites to hang around our classrooms and hallways. We constructed kites to fly out in the fields. We tied brightly colored streamers on the trees for decoration. We watched in amazement at birds that caught the air to soar and laughed at them if they tried to fly against its direction. In March the wind became REAL.

As we walk through this season of Lent, may we notice signs of the wind—not the weather outside but the wind of God (Spirit in English, Ruach in Hebrew, Pneuma in Greek) within and around us. Oddly, sometimes it takes slowing down and choosing silence in order to notice. There are many faith practices (spiritual disciplines) that give opportunity for silence—Centering Prayer, Prayer Walking, Lectio Divina, Breath Prayers and Music... You are welcome to join us for Centering Prayer in the church sanctuary on Tuesdays at 12:15 pm. If you want to explore other faith practices, I would love to help you get started!

Be sure to watch the daily Lenten devotions that are being posted on the OSLC Facebook page, the OSLC GROUP Facebook Page, and on a YouTube link from our church's website. We are using the small devotional book that you received in the mail "a story to tell." Different folks from our congregation are leading those devotions each day Monday – Friday.

Dust off your kite, because one of these days maybe we will gather a prayer group out in the open on a windy day! God's peace be with you...









Book Sale - A Meaningful Gift That Benefits a Great Cause!





About the Author

South Dakota author and storyteller, Tom Roberts, is originally a farm boy from the Ipswich/Aberdeen area, but he and his wife, Tammy, have been long-time residents of Sioux Falls. His affiliation with CHS began several years ago as a volunteer Santa Claus for the kids' Christmas party.

In 2002, the Roberts produced 'Twas The Night Before Christ and turned their book into a fundraiser for CHS. The success of this project eventually led to the hiring of both at Children's Home Foundation. Since then, over 60,000 copies of Tom's books have been sold, raising a net of nearly \$1.4 million.



Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

February 9, 2021 - 6:30 PM via ZOOM

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Rod Custer at 6:31. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Lee Campbell, Andy Binder, Rod Custer, Gary Dettman, Christopher Egerdahl, Dillon Haug, Deb Kimbell, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Helen Merriman, David Pummel, and Dawn Wood.
2. **What's on Top:** Members shared thoughts about the cold, kids-especially sick kids, family, visiting friends, vaccines, being "Zoomed out," and artistic creativity.
3. **Devotions:** Sherry Kloeckl used Isaiah 55:8 for her devotion. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, says the Lord." God sees the bigger picture for our lives. We should trust God's plan.
4. **Approve Agenda:** Helen Merriman moved to approve the agenda; Deb Kimbell seconded; motion carried.
5. **January Council Minutes:** David Pummel moved to approve the January minutes; Andy Binder seconded; motion carried.
6. **January Treasurer's Report:** David Pummel said that January was a good month. We took in \$3000 less than what was budgeted, but expenses were

also less than budgeted, so we are \$4704 ahead. We had no snow removal costs for January. We are doing amazingly well for the middle of a pandemic. The Thrivent Choice dollars are above \$10,000, which can be used to supplement budget needs. Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the January Treasurer's Report; Gary Dettman seconded; motion carried.

7. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura reported that it has been a good start to the new year. She has been scheduling council members, various group leaders, and others of the church to record video devotions from the "A story to tell" booklet. She is working with two study groups that meet on ZOOM. The Gather group meets once a month and their topic has been angels and messengers of God. A book discussion group of 15 people of different ages has been meeting, and Laura feels that ZOOM may make it easier for people to share their ideas. WELCA is planning a Secret Sister reveal on ZOOM, and plans are under way for the WELCA Spring Prayer Brunch & General Meeting scheduled for April. Author Tom Roberts will be speaking about his books which are sold as a fundraiser for Children's Home Society.

Pastor Stephan said that four couples have done all the preparation for their weddings this summer. The confirmation students (40 students in grades seven and eight) will have two more sessions together, then the eighth graders will meet for condensed units on The Lord's Prayer. Ash Wednesday will have four services (see newsletter for times) so that people can attend at a time convenient for them and with a smaller group. Ashes will be applied with a Q-tip as a precaution. Pastor Stephan will resume the weekly Lunch at The Living Room at noon on Thursday, February 18. The lessons and gospel readings scheduled for the Sunday two weeks in the future will be discussed.

The High School Youth Group, (eight to twelve students) meet at The Living Room on Wednesdays. In the summer of 2022, the group will have the opportunity to travel to Minneapolis, so it is time for us to start thinking of ways to support them. Summer camp is still an unknown, but there may be possibilities that could allow them to go safely.

8. Committee Updates

Senior Ministry, Education Committee, and Mission

Team: did not meet.

Property: Derek and Pastor Stephan spent time changing light bulbs in the ceiling of the sanctuary. The spotlights that illuminate the cross still need to be replaced, and a lift will need to be rented to do the replacement the very highest lights.

Finance Committee: discussed the several of hours that Andy Binder puts in each Sunday to handle the recording and streaming duties for each Sunday's service and the desire to compensate him somewhat for his time. Pastor Stephan stated that the Thrivent Choice Dollars have been used for technology in the past and could be used to fund the technician. Helen Merriman moved, with great gratitude, that Andy receive a \$50 per week stipend; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried. The stipend will be given through this year, and this position will then be added to and funded through the budget next year.

9. **COVID-19 Task Force Update:** The COVID Task Force has not met recently but will meet after Ash Wednesday. Since the number of infections in our area is going down, and vaccines are happening, Pastor Stephan is optimistic. Deb Kimbell asked if it might be a good time to ask Carrie Donovan to do another assessment of our space: how many people for how long?

10. **Group Singing:** Nancy Roberts, Voice Instructor at BHSU, joined the council to share information about when we might start singing in church again. She referenced the Colorado study, which said choirs need to wear masks, have members six feet apart, and change rooms after 30 minutes of singing because particles can hang in the air. The quality of air flow, as in how often the HVAC does and air exchange, is also part of the study. Pastor Stephan said that we could start by having the choir sing, or by having a recessional hymn to sing as we left the sanctuary. He will continue to study this issue.

11. **Determine Date for Annual Meeting of the Congregation:** April 18, two Sundays after Easter, was chosen for the Annual Meeting of the Congregation. Electing new members to the council will be on that agenda. The terms of three of our members will be ending at that time. Deb Kimbell moved to set the April 18 date; Cindy Koppinger seconded; motion carried.

12. **Adjourn:** Rod Custer adjourned the meeting at 7:35 which was followed by the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 9, 2021, at 6:30 PM. Sharing devotions in March will be Deb Kimbell.
