Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. When Elijah heard it,

he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice... (1 Kings 19:11-13a)

Dear Friends,

Can we talk about the wind?

As I write this, I'm listening to the wind whipping by my office window, revealing every aging and inadequate seal in said window's frame. It's blowing at over 20 mph presently and is supposed to remain between 20 and 35 mph for the next few days. I'd just chalk it up to spring in western South Dakota, but for the fact that where my house is located, on top of a high spot overlooking the Redwater River valley, this could be the situation pretty much *any* month out of the year. It strikes me how I seem to have a knack for choosing to reside in some of the most blustery places in the country... from Gillette, Wyoming to southeastern Minnesota (where wind turbines have sprung up like so many weeds over the course of the last years) to the western Dakotas.

The wind. It blows...pushes...irritates... hinders... at least from the perspective of a runner and outdoorsman who longs for calm climes. It's just... exhausting.

My son Kent and a couple of his buddies are presently on their way out to spend a few days hunting turkeys in northeastern Wyoming. When you've planned an outing, taken days off from work, made arrangements and committed yourself, you go forward regardless of wind and weather. The chance to wait for calmer, more temperate conditions is *not* an option. Instead, you change tactics.

Turkeys are no more fond of wind than we are. In the wind, they become vulnerable because they can't hear well. Hearing is one of a turkey's main defenses against predators. Not only that, but in the wind they can't hear *each other*. This being their breeding and nesting season, they find each other by calling, yelping, gobbling... arranging the trysts that lead to baby turkeys. Hence, it's kind of important that they can hear.

The tactics for finding them in the wind? Get down off the ridges and the high strutting areas, and start looking and listening below, in the protected valleys on the lee side of the prevailing winds. It's often in those out-of-the-wind places, where *you* can hear (and *they* can hear *better*) that you just might catch the telltale gobble of an amorous turkey<sup>©</sup>.

But you have to get out of the wind for a bit.

It's the policy of OSLC to send your rostered leaders on sabbatical once every five years and, as I'm now in my eleventh year with you, in the middle of this month I'll be embarking on a ten-week sabbatical, away from the day-to-day functions of our shared ministry. The opportunities presented to me as your pastor by a sabbatical for more intensive learning and study, as well as rest and reconnecting with family and friends is, when it comes right down to it, an opportunity to get out of the wind for a bit... to be able to listen for what God might have in mind next, not only for me but for us as an outpost of grace here in the northern Hills of South Dakota.

I hardly need to rehearse for you the "windy times" we've been living through as a people and as a congregation in these last few years. At the same time, just like my house on top of a high plain, the Church of Jesus Christ is always in the wind... called to be a place of strength and refuge and calm promise regardless of whatever hurricane-force gales might assail it. But sometimes... it's good to step out of the wind for a bit.

In the Old Testament book of 1 Kings, the prophet Elijah had been facing some mighty challenges as someone called to speak a word to God's people. I'm struck by the fact that in that little episode in the 19<sup>th</sup> chapter of 1 Kings, the prophet didn't hear God speaking in the mighty wind, nor in the cataclysmic noise of earthquake or fire. It was in the sound of "sheer silence" that God finally spoke. And if you check out what God spoke to him, you'll discover that it was the promise of help... assistance to continue the work in whatever winds or storms.

As grateful as I am to be given the opportunity for an extended Sabbath, a time out of the wind, I'm eternally more grateful for you, the people with whom I am privileged to share this ministry. Please pray for me while I am away, as I will be holding you in prayer. Think on what we have together as Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Spearfish, and the strength we enjoy in the Spirit of God blowing through this body of believers.

I look forward to us moving together, from strength to strength, in whatever wind.



#### Our Savior's Luthgran Church Council Minutgs April 11, 2023 - 6:30 PM ZOOM meeting OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, Fellowship and service through Jesus Christ.

- Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:30 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Andy Binder, Nichole Braithwait, Linda Easthouse, Chris Egerdahl, Deming Haugland, Karson Klein, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Christina Miles, Mat Ornelas, David Pummel, and Pam Tyma.
- **2. Devotions:** Pam Tyma shared a devotion focused on a quote she likes, "Worry is a conversation with yourself about things that you can't change. Prayer is a conversation with God about things that he can change." We should put everything in God's hands all the time.
- **3. What's On Top?** Council members shared about vacations and visitors, transition of the seasons and kids moving into this season's sports and activities, working every day, and looking forward to sabbatical. Some shared graduation, moving, new glasses, good health in the family, and changes in the family. Nearly all our shares were positive
- 4. Community Connection: Renae Servaty, the Executive Director of Victims of Violence Intervention Program Inc. which is still referred to as the Artemis House, was invited to share her work with domestic and sexual violence victims. Renae has been at this job for the past five months, but she worked for CASA prior, and the jobs have similarities. She is a member of OSLC and joined because she knew of the missions and the charities OSLC supports. The Artemis House has a 24-hour, confidential hotline which offers someone to talk to, crisis intervention assistance, information on domestic and sexual violence, and advocacy services. Last year, 3,000 calls were received and 366 people were served. The average stay at the shelter is 60 days, but many don't want to stay and would rather get on with their lives. They might need help with getting their documentation (driver's license, etc.), using the Food Pantry, finding housing, and much more. Renae cited the work of the advocates as vital to the success of those staying at the shelter or calling the hot line. The Victims of Violence Intervention Program, Inc. relies on federal and state money, local grants, and donations. Finding subsidized housing is a need and the biggest challenge. Everything is confidential. April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month.
- **5. Approve Agenda:** The agenda was amended to add "What's on Top." Christina Miles moved to approve the amended agenda; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- 6. Approval of the March Council Minutes: Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the minutes of the March meeting; Nichole Braithwait seconded; motion carried.
- 7. Approval of the March Treasurer's Report: Treasurer David Pummel said that March was an okay month with an income of \$45,797 with expenses of \$51,055. We did have snow removal expenses which should be coming to an end in the next months. The two Sundays in April were good for OSLC with offerings over \$30,000 and three more Sundays in the month. Mat Ornelas moved to approve the March treasurer's report; Chris Egerdahl seconded; motion carried.

#### 8. Ministerial Staff Reports:

**Deacon Laura Campbell** is in Watertown attending a synodical and theological convocation, meeting with deacons and pastors of the Synod.

**Pastor Stephan** has officiated lots of funerals lately, five in fifteen days, but he is so proud of the members of the congregation who rally around people in grief. Lent was good with strong attendance at Wednesday Word. Holy Week was also good; Laura had 55 people in attendance at the Easter Vigil service. Pastor Stephan has five or six baptisms coming up, and a wedding this Friday. New Members, 15-16 families, will be joining Our Savior's soon. The dinner and orientation for new members will be held on April 20. Pastor Stephan is getting everything ready in the office for when he goes on Sabbatical.

#### 9. Committee Updates:

#### Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

#### Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

#### Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

#### Snack providers (4):

Bring 4 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

#### Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
