As I write this, April is almost history... and a packed April it's been. We went from Palm Sunday and our Annual Congregational Meeting (and receiving new members) to Easter's celebration of the resurrection, then to our Education Celebration (end of Sunday/Wednesday School and Confirmation ministries). Heading into May, it's one special happening after another: Confirmation Sunday for our 8th graders on May 4, to Sr. Recognition Sunday for our high school graduates on Mother's Day, May 11. Then we welcome our Nicaraguan missionary, Anghy Aragon, on May 18. All of a sudden it's Memorial Day weekend!

Once we hit summer, Our Savior's Lutheran Church shifts into the summer worship schedule with only one service each Sunday at 9:00 A.M. and our Wednesday Word service goes on hiatus for a couple of months. We go to one service on Sunday mornings to bring our worshipping family together, so that 8:30-ers and 10:45-ers can get to know one another better. Also, it's a concession to the fact that, in the summer, we scatter. This building at the corner of State and Michigan gets a bit quieter during the weeks of June, July and August. We don't cease our ministries. We simply dial back our gathering a bit.

And all of this gets me thinking about MINISTRY... your ministry, in particular.

We gather as a people of God to do all sorts of things. We *gather* for worship, for study, for fun and for sharing. We *gather* as church to do things we couldn't do on our own: to care for others through our volunteer service and our sharing of money and time in ways that make a tremendous difference to others. We *gather* to celebrate and to mourn, to comfort and to be comforted, to challenge and to be challenged. And it's all important and good, the *gathering*.

But it's in the *scattering* that we really become apostles of the risen Christ. It's what *you* do when you're *not* gathered here that puts flesh on the love of Jesus. It's the faithful and careful work you do in the office, in the field, in the classroom, in the shop, on the road... in living out your God-given vocation. It's the way you respect, love and care for the people in your immediate sphere of influence on *this* day that declares your allegiance to Christ. It's the way you honor your spouse... protect, love, play with and discipline your kids that reveals who your Lord is.

The *gathering* is good and necessary. The *scattering* is absolutely essential! The difference we make in the lives we've been given hinges on the notion that we are not only "disciples" (students) but also "apostles" (sent ones).

When Jesus appeared to his first disciples on that first Easter evening (in the 20th chapter of John's Gospel), the first thing he did after showing them his scars was to make them *apostles*: "As the Father has sent me, **so I send you.**"

We'll also celebrate the reality that should we have a few less in our gatherings, we yet have over 1700 scattered apostles out there, still working, serving, travelling, camping, fishing, hiking, playing, loving, forgiving, abiding, praying, believing... and representing the risen Lord Jesus Christ in the world.



OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, Fellowship and service through Jesus Christ.

- Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:30 PM. Members present were Deming Haugland, Dave Pummel, Brady Harr, Christina Miles, Reed Haug, Pam Tyma, Sherry Kloeckl, Andy Binder, with Deacon Laura Campbell, and Pastor Stephan Sandness.
- 2. **Devotions:** Christina Miles shared an opening devotion exploring worries and answered prayers.
- **3. Approve Agenda:** Pam Tyma moved to approve the agenda as presented; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
- **4. Approval of the February Council Minutes:** Christina Miles moved to approve the February Council minutes as presented; Brady Harr seconded; motion carried.
- 5. Approval of theFebruary Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Dave Pummel presented the treasurer's report provided. February income was \$52,392.63 with expenses of \$56,747.59. The February income is approximately \$1,000 more than last February. Expenses for February do include \$8,143.95 for snow removal year-to-date. Overall year-to-date we remain \$8,587.00 in the black. Deming Haugland moved to approve the report as presented; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- 6. Ministerial Staff Reports: Pastor Stephan shared a bit on his preparation for Lent and taking time to be quiet. Tuesday at noon starts centering prayer, all are welcome. We had just over 330 people here for Ash Wednesday services. We are hosting Lenten Lunches starting on March 11th. The Bear Butte annual conference went well and included discussions regarding upcoming Synod Bishop elections. Deacon Laura started a bit on her recent and upcoming events, included taking part in a wedding at The Lodge and centering prayer on Tuesdays. Faith & Care leaders meet this week to continue efforts at getting more people involved and helping on Sundays. - 7. - 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:27 PM. Members present were Reed Haug, Sherry Kloeckl, Deming Haugland, Dave Pummel, Brady Harr, Karson Klein, Pam Tyma, Mike Steffen and Andy Binder with Deacon Laura Campbell, and Pastor Stephan Sandness.
- 2. **Devotions:** Pam Tyma shared an opening devotion based on Psalm 23.
- **3. Approve Agenda:** Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the agenda as presented; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- **4. Approval of the March Council Minutes:** Dave Pummel moved to approve the March Council minutes as presented; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
- 5. Approval of the April Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Dave Pummel presented the treasurer's report provided. April income was \$58,233.67 with expenses of \$50,368.39. Year-to-date income sit at \$174,024.73 with expenses of \$157,572.45. Overall this places us in a very good position moving into the summer season, which often shows lower income rates. Mike Steffen moved to approve the report as presented; Brady Harr seconded; motion carried.
- 6. Ministerial Staff Reports: Deacon Laura is looking forward to receiving around eight families of new members coming up on Thursday. The new member team has been busy preparing for the Thursday new members dinner and events. Laura shared some member communications and family thank you letters. Laura has recently returned from the synod candidacy committing meetings and noted we have a number of good strong candidates coming up across the synod. Laura closed with notes about Lent prays wrapping up this next week. Pastor Stephan noted a very busy calendar moving through April into May with Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, congregational meeting, new member events, high school senior Sunday, 8th grade faith statement, celebration Sunday wrapping up the year's education. Stephan noted we will again be moving back to one service in May. Stephan extended a thank you to Pam and everyone who has been helping with Sunday coffee time and all things kitchen. Wednesday night services have been very well attended this year with approximately 160 people each night. March was a month of funerals, which followed possibly the longest stretch without any funerals Pastor has experienced. There are also a number of baptisms coming up with four already planned for April.
- 7: Committee Reports: Education committee reported we have seen 30 kids added to the cradle roll over this past year. Celebration Sunday preparations are well in the works. The committee has also been working on Confirmation and Graduation preparations. Currently we have seven kids signed up for Summer Camp. It was noted our Campus Ministry students include two who plan to work at camp this summer. We are also looking for extending scholarships for these two.
 - Senior ministry will again be doing Mayday baskets for our seniors on the first Sunday of May. Properties committee is looking at redoing weather stripping around the windows of the church this spring and wrapping up the small roof leak repairs as weather allows. A discussion was had about replacing the Fellowship Hall chairs with new ones like the gray chairs recently acquired for The Living Room. All present agreed this is a good idea. Pastor Stephan will present on this plan at the upcoming annual meeting of the congregation. The council will take further action on this during the May council meeting. The church's cloud storage data backup contract with Northern Hills tech has ended. We are looking at appropriate affordable alternative backup options. A new computer has been purchased with memorial funds for the sanctuary projection computer. We will be looking at upgrading the MediaShout projection software to a subscription plan with this new computer. A short discussion was had about child care help for the Young Adults Bible Study nights. Currently our nursery staff having been helping out with this need. We are looking to make this bible study child care more of an official part of the annual budget.
 - New council member names have been brought forward by the nomination committee. The congregation will vote on accepting Lana Maine and Laura Bosworth as our new council members at the upcoming annual meeting.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION April 13, 2025 – 9:45 AM

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, Fellowship and service through Jesus Christ.

- Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 9:45am. There were 81 congregational members present.
- 2. Adoption of the Agenda: Leesa Haugland moved to approve the agenda; Pat Williams Seconded; motion carried.
- **3. Opening Prayer:** Pastor Stephan Sandness offered an opening prayer.
- 4. Approval of the November 10, 2024, Semi-Annual Meeting Minutes: Christina Miles moved to approve the November 10, 2024 meeting minutes. Dale Donat seconded; motion carried.
- 5. 2023/2024 Treasurer's Reports: David Pummel reported that the churches finances are very strong. 2024 ended with an income of \$639,649.82 and expenses of \$615,245.69. Providing for a \$24,404.13 surplus. 2025 year-to-date income stands at \$115,791.06 with expenses of \$107,204.06. Leaving a surplus of \$8,587.00 year-to-date, which is a great way to enter the summer season and allows us to be well prepared for ever increasing property insurance rates. Carleen Rosencranz moved to approve the treasurer's report; Mike Konstant seconded; motion carried.
- 6. Council and Committee Members: Current council members were introduced. Deming Haugland has agreed to stay on for another term with council. Christina Miles is stepping down as her term has ended. The council extended a big thank you for Christina's commitment and involvement with the council. Members were directed to the annual report for a full listing of committee assignments.
- 7. Nominating Committee Report: The nominating committee has put forward Lana Mane and Laura Bosworth for installation to the council along with Deming Haugland to extend into another term.
- 8. Election of Church Council: A motion to cease nomination and cast a unanimous ballot for Deming Haugland, Lana Main, and Laura Bosworth was made by Dale Donat; second by Helen Merriman; motion carried.
- 9. Action on Written Reports
 9a. Staff Reports: Pastor Stephan extended his thanks to the council and congregation for their ongoing support for our collective mission. He additionally noted how blessed he is to have such a strong group of staff members to work with.

Pastor Stephan directed members to the printed report for further information and updates. - 10. Delegates to the SD Synod Assembly: Synod Assembly will be May 30 May 31, 2025. Our congregation can send six delegates to the SD Synod Assembly. Members interested in representing OSLC can speak with Pastor Stephan, Deacon Laura, or President Andy.
- 11. Floor Open for Congregation Comments: The congregation requested an update on The Living Room and Campus Ministry. Pastor Stephan reported The Living room has been very regularly used for various bible studies, high school youth group, and Thursday noon events. Additionally, the facility is actively used by our new campus ministry efforts. Previously campus ministry was a joint effort between BHSU and SD School of Mines. That joint effort has been dissolved. The OSLC campus ministry committee has worked hard over the past few years to develop the new OSLC/BHSU campus ministry. Currently the committee is continuing to seek a permanent campus ministry staff member. In the meantime, we have a very involved interim campus ministry pastor who has done very well building a strong regular group of involved BHSU students. Two of these students will be working as camp councelors this summer.
- **12. Adjournment:** The meeting adjourned with a motion by Dale Donat; second by Diane Bryan at 10:00am.
- **13. Closing Prayer:** Pastor Stephan Sandness provided a closing prayer.


