My dear friends,

During a couple of days in November this year, I have the privilege of serving as Chaplain for the South Dakota Synod's "First Call Retreat" over in Chamberlain. All relatively new pastors in the South Dakota Synod (a couple dozen), those who have just graduated from seminary and are in the first three years of their first call to a parish, gather for some continuing education and sharing of experiences as they find their feet as pastors in our Church. My job as Chaplain at that event is to lead devotions each morning and evening, as well as to be available, along with Synod staff, for one-on-one time with whoever might want conversation.

Needless to say, I've been sweating it. I don't regard myself as a repository of wisdom when it comes to being a pastor. What I do have is some mileage on me, though, and maybe that's enough[©]. Fortunately, the theme for this gathering is the Gospel of Matthew, which just happens to be a favorite of mine. It's shot through with the proclamation that God is with us, here and now... that the kingdom of heaven is as near as your own breath. Matthew's is the Gospel that proclaims Jesus as "Emmanuel," which literally means "God is with us!"

The devotions I'll be leading and the preaching I'll be doing with this bunch of pastors and deacons finding their way in the early days of their ministry will all be grounded in this very simple yet profound reality: *God is with us. Heaven is at our fingertips.* And whether we're called and set apart as public servants of the Word (pastors and deacons) or lay-persons who live out our ministries in offices, classrooms, fields or homes, our living and our witnessing to the love of God in Jesus is buttressed by this one solid fact: in Jesus, God has shown up. Here. With us. Even now. That is a hope I have clung to when all other lights have seemed dim... when the road seems too difficult and the call too heavy and my own strength too lacking. God is here.

In the middle of this next month, on November 13, we as a congregation meet in semi-annual meeting to vote on a spending plan for the next year. As an outpost of grace here in Spearfish, God gives us a lot to do. We want to do it. And at the same time, the world around us gives us plenty of reasons to be nervous and frightened. We wonder... will we be able to do the work given us to do, or will it prove too heavy?

Well, *God is with us.* I'm grateful that the month ends in Thanksgiving. Looking back on God's provision in the past is fuel for courage moving into an uncertain future. Of all the things we *can't* know, this one thing we *can*: God is with us! Thanks be to God!





Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

October 11, 2023 - 6:30 PM, The Conference Room

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:34 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Andy Binder, Nichole Braithwait, Linda Easthouse, Christopher Egerdahl, Deming Haugland, Karson Klein, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Christina Miles, Mat Ornelas, David Pummel, and Pam Tyma.
- 2. What's on Top? Members shared information about a basement disaster, kids changing activity seasons, windows finally being replaced after the hailstorm, winterizing, a father's death, a friend's funeral, a three-week old baby girl, grandkid stuff, work, lots of weddings, a vacation, 45th college reunion, and a granddaughter's pet buffalo.
- 3. **Devotions:** Linda Easthouse shared a devotion based on Philippians 4:13. "I can do all things in him who strengthens me." We need a can-do attitude.
- 4. **Approve Agenda:** The agenda was amended to have our community connection earlier in the meeting. Sherry Kloeckl moved to approve the amended agenda; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- 5. **Community Connection:** Linda Williams from Western Resources for Independent Living shared her experiences working with senior adults. She shared stories focused on how the smallest help or the largest sacrifice may be needed to get someone what they need. She says people need someone to notice them, listen to them, and care about them.
- 6. Approval of the September Council Minutes: Christina Miles moved to approve the minutes of the September meeting; David Pummel seconded; motion carried.
- 7. Approval of the September Treasurer's Reports: David Pummel said that income is at 67 percent of what was budgeted for September, but that expenses were also at 67 percent of what was budgeted, so we broke even for the month. We still have about \$6,000 less than what had been budgeted for the year, but we are \$1,500 ahead of where we were last year at this time. David is confident that we will end the year in a good financial position. Mat Ornelas moved to approve the September treasurer's report; Christopher Egerdahl seconded; motion carried.
- 8. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura Campbell enjoys the opportunities she has that make connections between members: visitations, home

communions, and working with various ministries. The Friendship Ministers met in September with the topic of "Recommitting to Serve" and were Installed/Blessed in worship on October 2. Their Fall schedule is underway. A new group, the SonShine Squad gather to make a craft or a card to take to homebound members to provide a cheerful visit. Cheryl Wormstadt leads this group. LuMin the Hills campus ministry gathers at The Living Room on Monday evenings at 6:00 PM. Congregation members are invited to get to know the students by providing a meal. Sign up through the Meal Train link. At least three of the students are worshipping with us regularly at OSLC. OSLC WELCA hosted the Bear Butte Conference Fall Retreat at Outlaw Ranch. After two years of no retreat, they were thrilled with the attendance this year. Laura provided part of the program. New members, a group of 10-15 family units, will gather for dinner and orientation on November 10 and will be received in worship on Sunday. November 13.

Pastor Stephan Sandness shared an opportunity with the council to listen to and share a conversation with our synod leadership. On October 18, our bishop and others will meet at South Canyon Lutheran Church in Rapid City at 6:30 PM. This meeting will be the first since 2019. Pastor Stephan has spent the last month focused on children's ministries: Bible studies to get to know their new Bibles, first communion preparations, confirmation, and more. On October 16, various children's spaces will be blessed: the baptismal font, the busy bags, and the Pray Ground. Sunday and Wednesday school volunteers will be installed at either service as well. Wednesday suppers and Wednesday Word are going well. Lunch at The Living Room on Thursdays at noon is still happening, but there is room for more people to attend that hour of Bible study.

9. Committee Reports:

Education: Nursery caregivers are available during Sunday church services. Cradle Roll welcomed Millie Roy, daughter of Cali and Chris Egerdahl. KidZone has 20 students enrolled as of October 3. Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 6 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
