Happy November!

As I write this, there are about 70 more shopping days until Christmas. At least, that's how commerce would measure our days. Before this month is over, we will have paused with our neighbors and families to give thanks for

another year of blessings, and then begin the preparations for the celebration of God's appearing in human flesh, born in humble poverty. As such, the season lends itself to reflections of gratitude and concrete responses of love and generosity. What does it look like to be truly grateful for the gifts poured by God into one's life, and then respond in kind? Hence, the whole idea of gift-giving (no matter how commercialized and commodified it may appear...)

A confession I have made previously and remains the case: I actually love to shop for gifts. Birthdays, Christmas, special occasions... doesn't matter. *I love the hunt...* to track down that perfect gift that will astound, surprise and maybe even shock the recipient into uncontrollable spasms of wonder at what a great gift-giver I am! What can I give this person that will truly say "I know you better than you know yourself... what you like, what you love, what you want!?" I want mine to be the present they remember from all the piles of presents they might otherwise receive. No socks or underwear or anything "useful" and ordinary from me, no sir!

I used to tease my wife for being such a hopeless gift-giver. I'd open a Christmas or a birthday present from her and wonder if she's been paying any attention at all over the years!

But lest you think I'm tooting my own horn here for being such a *generous* person, think again. You see, I *have* been paying attention, and here's the truth:

For all of the marvelous gifts I've procured for my loved ones over the years... the Christmas gifts, the birthday presents... I have this sneaking suspicion that now that my kids are grown and are (for the most part) out of my house, they are probably hard-pressed to recall any of the wonderful presents that I showered on them at least twice-yearly. But here is what they *will* recall: the hours their mom spent with them wrestling over homework... the hundreds of books their mom read to them at bedside, or at least the same few books read over and over by request hundreds of times at bedside, every night... the trips with Mom in the van to the dentist, to the doctor, to the grocery store, to any of a thousand different places they needed to be hauled... the dirty laundry that magically disappeared from their bedroom floors daily only to reappear in their drawers clean and folded. They will recall now the very thing they seemed oblivious to back then: the generosity of a mom who gave every day all of herself for them. It's not flashy, but it's the only generosity that in the end can truly be called generous, because it cost the giver the greatest measure of herself.

It's always more self-gratifying to be the provider of the occasional desert than to be the one who day after day sets out the meal.

When it comes to our giving, are we giving primarily for the feeling we get in doing so, for the esteem or the thanks or the recognition... or because it's simply our way of being in the world? The occasional gift to the building project at church or to the United Way annual fund drive is good and necessary, but can it replace the daily routine of a life lived for others through the less-obvious acts of regular no-strings-attached giving? The act of writing that offering check every week or month is certainly not glamorous, and sometimes you may grumble all the way through the writing of it, but that's the discipline of an other-directed life, isn't it?

The most generous person I know is the one who gives even when she doesn't want to. She must be acting out of a will other than her own. I can think of no other explanation. *Why do you think she does it?*

As we approach the end of another fiscal year here at OSLC, we find ourselves approximately \$30,000 behind. Understanding that the last two months of the year remaining are always our most robust when it comes to squaring our budget, it's still significant. We have been incredibly responsible and frugal in our spending, being about \$25,000 UNDER budget currently... but gifts have lagged, leaving us with this current challenge.

When I think of Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Spearfish, South Dakota, I don't have to search hard for my own gratitude. I'm grateful for so many here who are constantly busy finding ways to bless others with the greatest measure of themselves. I see and feel it in our serving, our worship, our fellowship and in our learning together. I see and feel it in the way so many share their resources of time and money and passion so regularly and so unreservedly. I invite you to reflect of this and to see and feel it too... how this congregation and the larger community is blessed by the ministries worked out in this place. And then, in reflecting on it, to take pleasure in finding your unique part in it. We are blessed... to be a blessing!



Devotions for Advent 2023: "Come, Emmanuel"



Explore the Advent season and celebrate the joy of the twelve days of Christmas and the day of Epiphany. Come, Emmanuel includes daily devotions for the first Sunday of Advent) through Epiphany (January 6, 2024). In addition to devotions, the book offers household blessings and prayers to enrich your preparations and celebrations.

In Come, Emmanuel we join Christians around the world, past and present, in the Advent tradition of reflecting on brief prayers known as the "O Antiphons." Christians have used the O Antiphons since the eighth century or perhaps even longer. On the first day of each set of devotions, a contemporary version of the antiphon serves as the scripture text, and a stanza from "O come, O come, Emmanuel" serves as the "To ponder" quotation. The next four days in the set include scripture texts traditionally associated with the antiphon and quotes chosen by the writers.

Emmanuel came that first Christmas. Emmanuel comes to us today. Emmanuel will come again. Rejoice and share the good news! Look for these Advent devotional booklets to be available for pick-up on the Ushers' counter near the sanctuary doors at Our Savior's sometime in the middle of November. We hope you'll grab one for your household!

Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes

October 10, 2023 - 6:30 PM, The Conference Room

OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:35 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Deacon Laura Campbell, Mike Steffen, Nichole Braithwait, Linda Easthouse, Karson Klein, Sherry Kloeckl, Christina Miles, David Pummel, Pam Tyma, Brady Harr, and Deming Haugland.
- 2. **Devotions:** Andy Binder talked about "What is Faith?" Hebrews 11:1 states, "Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." While we know that it is not visible, we 100% have faith and it is an amazing thing how we are convicted in our faith.
- 3. **Community Connection:** Continue to brainstorm and think about who we need to hear from and what are our sources of support within the community. The council is open to suggestions.
- 4. **Approve Agenda:** David Pummel moved to approve the agenda; Christina Miles seconded; motion carried.
- 5. Approval of the September Council Minutes: Christina Miles moved to approve the September meeting minutes; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- 6. Approval of the August Treasurer's Report: David Pummel reported that year to date we are at \$415,489 versus \$387,558 at this time last year. Year to date, we are doing ok and still growing into our budget. Overall, we are negative approximately \$24,000.00, with time to overcome. Linda Easthouse moved to approve the September treasurer's report; Mike Steffen seconded; motion carried.
- 7. **2024 Budget:** The finance committee presented their 2024 budget, discussed the proposal, justified the slight increases, and amended some of the figures to better capture the intent for next year. The council is looking forward to presenting the budget for approval to the congregation in November. Mike Steffen moved to approve the amended 2024 budget; Pam Tyma seconded; motion carried.
- 8. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Deacon Laura passed on that this month she particularly enjoyed continuing education at the Fall Theological Conference in Pierre with speaker Dr. Barbara Rossing and leading time with our Preschoolers on a Sunday morning learning about their new Story Bible. Friendship Ministry hosted Linda Farber who spoke on the topic of loneliness. Women of our church participated in the Bear Butte Conference WELCA Fall Retreat at Outlaw Ranch hosted by the women of Woyatan Lutheran Church. She encourages us all to

participate in a new Sunday morning Bible exploration entitled Animate beginning October 15 at 9:45 am led by Jan Holz. It includes a brief video presentation and lively conversation. There will be a Ministry Fair on Sunday, October 22, between worship services. Tables for various ministry groups (learning, service, and support) will be set up to encourage involvement. On Wednesday, November 1, at 6:26 pm will be a Service of Prayer for the Healing of the Nations. Pastor Stephan passed on that he is still busy with a lot of funerals and is beyond impressed with how this congregation takes care of people during these difficult times. He passes on his thanks to all who assist. He talked about the upcoming Bear Butte conference where he hopes to have a great conversation about the direction of campus ministry. Further, he passed on reminders for the upcoming children's milestones with first communion taking place on Reformation Sunday and was happy to say that confirmation is progressing well.

- 9. **Committee Reports:** Brief committee updates passed on that the Mission Team is working on coordination for the Angel Tree and the Fix It team is to be honored at a brunch for all their hard work and contributions to making and keeping our church in tip top shape, on Tuesday, 24 October at 8:30am.

Welcome Center Hosts (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by the Welcome Centers (one on each side). Warmly greet each group as they arrive.

Ushers (2):

Arrive 30 minutes before the service begins. Stand by counters by the glass doors of the Sanctuary (one on each side). Welcome each family group or individual as they enter, hand them a bulletin, and assist them to find a seat if necessary. Count all heads in the room and record the number on the chart at the counter. At the time of communion, begin at the **front** and release one row at a time. If there are people in the Southeast section, start them first. Be the last to go up for communion.

Communion assistants (2):

During the Offering, go to the Sacristy behind the altar and wash your hands with soap and water. Pick up a cup for wine. Then come out and stand by the bell cabinet during the Words of Institution and Lord's Prayer. Pastor will serve you communion. He will then give you a tray of bread (wafers). There are also gluten free wafers in small containers on the rail. Follow the pastor's lead to move to the front of the rail. As each person comes to you, place a wafer on their open hand (without touching the person) saying, "The body of Christ, given for you." If the person asks for gluten free, give them one of the bread containers from the rail. Upon finishing, hand the tray back to the pastor.

Snack providers (4):

Bring 6 dozen cookies or bars to the church kitchen by 8 am on Sunday morning (or on Friday by 3 pm prior to your Sunday).

Coffee Servers (2):

Check in with the Kitchen Coordinator (Pam Englund) by 8:15 am to familiarize yourself with the kitchen and

to get instructions. She will have coffee and lemonade prepared. Keep the cookie trays in the kitchen until right before serving. Return to the kitchen after communion. Put cookie trays and coffee urns on the serving table. Be ready to serve at 9:30 am. Serve coffee as people come through the line. Near the end of coffee hour, assist the Kitchen Coordinator with cleanup as instructed—putting things away, washing dishes, wiping down tables/chairs.
