To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven. (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

Dear Friends,

Everyone has their "favorite time of the year." Some like the spring, with its retreat of the cold and snow. Some live for winter... for its skiing, snowmobiling, ice-fishing, etc. Some would just as soon have July last for twelve months out of the year. I prefer October, for not a few reasons: The opportunity to sit in a tree, bow in hand, hoping to put venison in my freezer for the winter... to go out for a run and not have to worry about wilting in the heat or fighting frostbite. The days are crisp and often sunny, the wind hasn't started to blow with a vengeance yet, and the peculiar, wonderful smell of fallen leaves fills the nostrils. It's the smell of October I like best, because it also fills the head with memory.

In the small town in which I lived as a child of four or five years old, everyone would be burning leaves this time of year. To this day, whenever I get a good whiff of burning leaves, in my mind's eye I can see the old Victorian, clapboard parsonage we lived in... I can see our yard with its rusty swing set, our old lab, Sheeba, in her kennel... and I'm there again, in a small town that seemed so huge to me as a child. They say that the sense of smell is the most powerful trigger of memory, and whenever I smell October leaves burning, I know it's true.

As I write this, we're in the middle of First Communion instruction with our fifth-graders here at Our Savior's Lutheran Church. We're preparing to welcome them to the Lord's table to receive God's grace and forgiveness in bread and wine. This momentous stepping-stone in their faith lives will occur on Sunday, October 9 (...another reason to like October!) In our class time together, we're exploring the mysteries of this wonderful gift from God, the Sacrament of the Altar... how through ordinary, tangible elements like bread and wine Jesus chooses to meet us directly, on our tongues and straight to our hearts. It was in the course of preparing for these classes that I was again reminded of the power of the sense of smell.

You see, as a small child in that same small town of October's burning leaves, another smell was cemented into my memory... the smell of Communion Sunday. Our church was just small enough that, on those special Sundays of the Sacrament, (we communed only once a month back then) even a little kid knew something special was happening because even a little kid could smell the wine, both in the cups on the altar and on his mother's breath when she returned to the pew. I'm beginning to understand why God has given this precious gift of forgiveness in bread and wine... that even the simple mind of a child might know that as his congregation communes, he is in the middle of a holy moment.

On **Sunday, October 9**, we welcome a new group of young people to the table to eat with us and share this holy moment. I hope and pray that you, as their faith family, will be at that table, too... not simply to support them and celebrate with them this milestone in their faith-life, but also because you, too, need what God has to give there.

October is an incredible time of vivid, brilliant change all around. God continues to do amazing things among us! As your pastor, I challenge you to let God do amazing things through *you*, as you worship, as you work, as you pray and as you play.



OUR MISSION: Inspired by God's grace, we open our hearts to all in faith, prayer, fellowship, and service through Jesus Christ.

- 1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by Andy Binder at 6:32 PM. Members present were Pastor Stephan Sandness, Andy Binder, Nichole Braithwait, Linda Easthouse, Christopher Egerdahl, Deming Haugland, Karson Klein, Sherry Kloeckl, Cindy Koppinger, Christina Miles, David Pummel, and Pam Tyma.
- 2. **What's on Top?** Members shared information about family and friend time, the busyness of school starting, the busyness of work, quite a few children and grandchildren starting preschool, finishing summer projects, birthday parties, a family member recovering from illness, and getting ready for a new baby.
- 3. **Devotions:** Sherry Kloeckl shared a humorous devotion, "Ageing Explained," about the different ways that we as humans face our life, and life span, and how the animals around us might face their lives.
- 4. **Approve Agenda:** "Discussion of a Nursery Caregiver" was added to the agenda. Deming Haugland moved to approve the agenda as amended; Sherry Kloeckl seconded; motion carried.
- 5. **Approval of the August Council Minutes:** David Pummel moved to approve the minutes of the August meeting; Linda Easthouse seconded; motion carried.

Christina Miles moved to approve the August treasurer's report; Nichole Braithwait seconded; motion carried.
- 7. **Ministerial Staff Reports:** Pastor Sandness is putting summer behind him with the start of the program year by having Confirmation Orientation on Wednesday the 7th. We will have Wednesday Word again on September 14, and Beth has done a great job of getting the various Sunday/Wednesday School and youth education programs ready to go. Our switch back to two services at the end of summer, helped attendance numbers go up significantly on Sunday the 11th. New members will be welcomed to the congregation on November 13.

Pastor Stephan continued his report by sharing thank you cards sent to OSLC over the last few months. The first was from a boy who will be starting kindergarten and the next level of faith instruction. He wanted to say thank you for the pizza at the organizational meeting. The second thank you came from St. Dysmas for our gift from the Love Your Neighbor Jar. Two thank you cards came from a Thrivent Action Team thanking us for the donation of diapers and a donation of \$1,915.16 from the LYNJ to the Artemis House. Amelia Klug sent a thank you for the gift of a scholarship as she goes on to study at Augustana. We received a thank you from Lutheran Disaster Response for helping families during disasters, and another from St. James Lutheran Church in Belle Fourche for our donation following the hailstorm in June. Pastor Stephan's point in sharing these cards was to let us know that our gifts and simple kindnesses to others are recognized and appreciated. We make a difference in the world.



For each visit, the Elder Center staff brings an activity to do with the elders. By rearranging schedules, we were able to program each elder to receive two visits each month. The elders love the visits, and we love the quality time we are able to spend with each elder.

Although we had hoped to reopen the Elder Center in July, COVID-19 cases are on the rise again, and we've opted to wait for numbers to go down. We have been able to have small group activities with the elders in their communities. Our friends from La Puerta Abierta have been holding reading activities with the elders, and it's nice to see the elders reconnect with each other again. We hope to be able to reopen the Elder Center within the next couple of months.

The home visits have been warmly received by the elders, and we would like to continue to carry them out once the Center is reopened. Since the staff will be busy preparing meals, we would like the elders to take over the visits to their peers. Over the next few months, we will help the elders to form committees in their neighborhoods and show them the ropes. It will be another way for the elders to get involved and take on leadership in the program.
