"...be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Eph. 5:18b – 20)

The author of the letter to the Ephesians tells us to "be filled" with the Spirit... with *music*, with *singing*. Interesting.

Some folks say they don't like to sing. That's usually code for "I don't think anybody wants to hear me sing because I'm afraid it'd sound like a coyote being strangled mid-howl." But if we put recording devices in y' all's showers or cars or trucks, I bet we'd hear plenty of singing. When we're at our least self-conscious, we're at our most musical... and we *are* musical beings.

And what is it about *song* that moves us to sing? All we need to answer that question is to ask another: *"What are your favorite songs?"* And it has to be favorite "songs" plural, not favorite song. Favorite worship song? Favorite love song? Favorite break-up song? Favorite celebration song? Favorite song about death and loss? Favorite party song? Favorite peaceful song?

I remember as a freshman in college, there was a guy on our floor whose girlfriend broke up with him. For a week straight, he was blasting Boy George's song "Do You Really Want to Hurt Me?" from his dorm room stereo system (and this was back in the day when the size of your stereo system was a status symbol, so... yeah, it was loud.) By the end of the week, all of us on the floor were like, "Yeah, as a matter of fact, we do "really want to hurt you!" Turn that damn thing off or put on some Motorhead or Motely Crue... anything else! Get over it!"

And there you go. Usually our favorites go beyond *"something with a good beat that you can dance to."* The songs that stay with you convey something to you... carry to you a feeling, an emotion, a memory that places you smack-dab in the middle of that feeling again. (That's maybe why so many of us still gravitate towards the songs of our youth... back when feelings and emotions were so raw and heavy they seemed like *everything* at the time.) Song gives voice to relationship and puts you in touch with something so visceral and so deep, it's like... well... it's like feasting at a banquet, especially when you share the song with another.

Singing is like a doorway that you open, allowing yourself to be filled... sometimes with memory, or with emotion, or motivation. When we sing as part of our worship, it's like opening a doorway for the Spirit of God to enter in, to draw us closer not just in memory but in real time:

"O Lord, my God, when I in awesome wonder consider all the worlds thy hand has made..." Don't you feel yourself drawn deeper into the reality of the creating God?

"Were you there when they crucified my Lord? Were you there when they crucified my Lord? Oh, sometimes it causes me to tremble, tremble, tremble. Were you there when they crucified my Lord?" Aren't you transported right there, to his crucifixion?

"Jesus Christ is risen today! Alleluia!" Boom! You're at the empty tomb on Easter morning.

"Silent night. Holy night. All is calm, all is bright..." And we're with Him at the manger cradle, the author of heaven and earth now wrapped in skin and swaddling clothes in the arms of Mary.

The songs transport us as a whole right into the closest communion with God.

For decades, I've had the privilege of bringing worship into numerous care facilities, nursing homes, and the like. It's a lesson in true humility for most preachers, because I'll tell you something: the elders making up the congregation in such places really aren't hungry for the fruits of a preacher's study and sermon-craft. Many will sleep right through it, and they won't be shy about it. What wakes them? It's the songs... the ones that live deep in the recesses of soul and memory that place them once again in a relationship with the living God. *That* feeds them.

Clothe-a-Kid 2024

Clothe-a-Kid was able to support 150 students this year, which was fewer students than our goal.

Unfortunately, issues with the registration process began in July, and some families had double and triple registered, which was not caught until the day that school supplies were distributed.

Clothe-a-Kid raised over \$30,000 due to the effort of OSLC and three other churches, businesses, local community members, and an anonymous donation of \$2,000. We spent over \$27,000 on student shopping at our local Walmart, and this year, students were given a chance to go to the Shoe Dept (a local business in the strip mall near Walmart) to spend up to \$40 per student on a new pair of shoes, which added about \$5300 to the shopping total.

On August 19, Clothe-a-Kid distributed bags filled with school supplies and a Spartan hoodie to eligible Spearfish Spartan students. On August 20, these students went shopping to choose clothes that fit their style and needs. Black Hills Community Bank employees raised approximately \$3000 for school supplies for all 150 students, so they can feel more confident of success on their first day of school!

Our Savior's Lutheran Church raised \$10,067.55 through donations and the Love Your Neighbor Jar. The generosity of our congregation plays a significant role in the success of Clothe-a-Kid and its positive influence for the 150 students in Spearfish. The Mission Team cannot thank you enough for supporting Clothe-a-Kid.

He passed on that Worship in the Park was a great event again this year and widely attended with an estimated 230 people. He further remarked that fall and holiday planning is already starting and that the calendar is filling up quickly. Confirmation will have a large class of 7th graders this year with orientation scheduled for 11 September at 6pm. September 18 is the official kickoff for confirmation and Wednesday Word has resumed the normal schedule. Further, Pastor Stephan passed on that September 15-17 is the Synod Fall Theological Convocation meeting in Pierre. He ended his updates with a fun note that he will be asking all to provide feedback on their favorite hymns. Be on the lookout for a "ballot" in your bulletin!
- 7. Committee Reports: Education committee passed on that September 8 is "Back to School Sunday" and September 18 the start of confirmation. They are still looking for a couple of Sunday School teachers if anybody is interested. It was a successful camper season with 14 kids going to camp this year on \$4200 worth of scholarships. Senior Ministry briefed that the "Bless the Years" birthday celebration was to be held August 18. Mission Team thanks the congregation for their generosity this summer. The Clothe-a-Kid program was a great success with OSLC folks contributing an incredibly generous \$10,067.55 toward the total gathered in the community which was \$23,000. Children and parents will be picking up their clothes on August 19 and 20! The ELCA World Hunger Offering in April was great this year, too, providing \$2,969.01. God's Work. Our Hands. Sunday will be on Rally Sunday, September 8. Mission Team will once again organize the preparation of Hygiene Kits for the Pine Ridge Reconciliation Center. A request for donation of items will be in upcoming bulletins and the September newsletter. Mission Team will prepare the first Wednesday evening supper on September 18 with proceeds going to Missionary Support. The property team updated that they successfully knocked out some big projects this year, the group is growing, which is hugely welcome, and they look forward to some preventative maintenance time. Campus Ministry is off and running with a new board, constitution, site profile page and a team dedicated to success in the new year. Continued on page 11
